

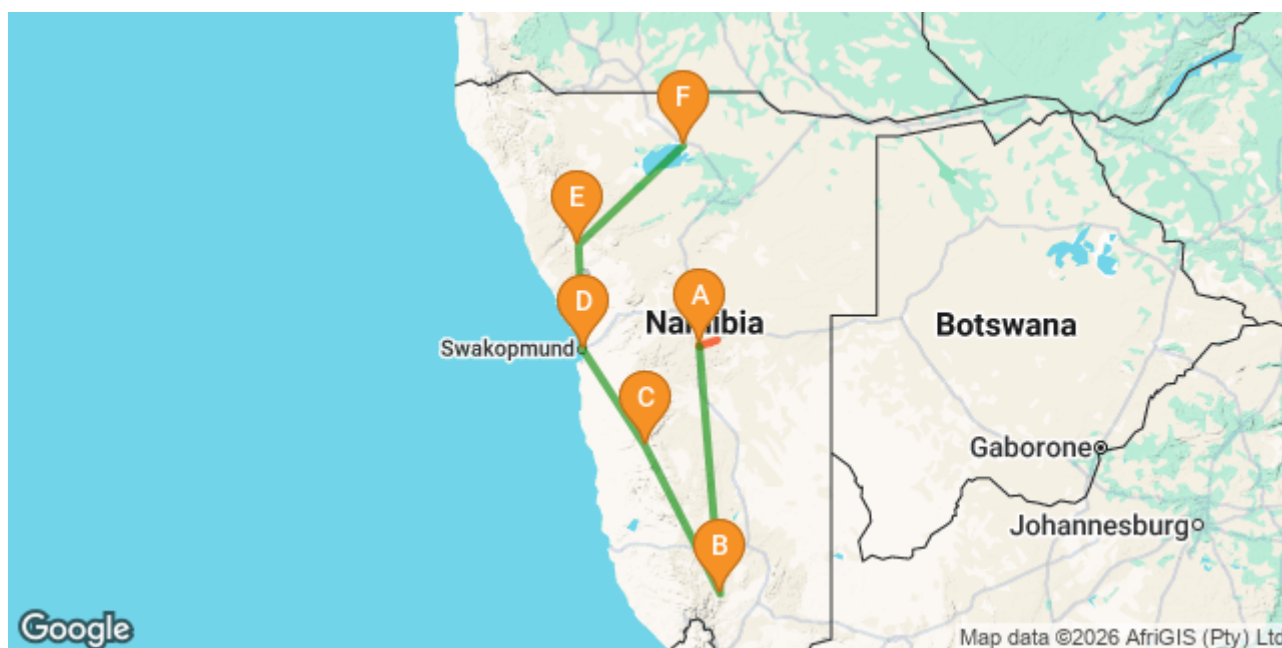

Our 13 Day Namibia by Private Air (4* Fly in Safari Tour™) is a privately guided fly in safari tour of Namibia. The safari conveniently starts and ends in Windhoek, the capital of Namibia. What better way to experience this vast desert country than by jetting around in private light aircraft on scenic flights from one remote destination to the next with an experienced guide.

Due to the use of a private aircraft for the duration of the tour, it means you will have maximum flexibility. With Namibia being known for its breathtaking contrasting landscapes, this is truly a spectacular country to see on a fly in safari tour. It really puts things into perspective to see natural wonders such as the Fish River Canyon, the Namib Desert dunes, Damaraland and the Etosha Park from the air.

Due to the short light aircraft flights between destinations, it means travel time are kept to the minimum and the maximum amount of time is spent at the destinations exploring the areas. An experienced naturalist guide will make sure you are educated and informed on the natural wonders, wildlife and cultures you will encounter.

This exceptional safari includes unique experiences such as an exhilarating 4x4 adventure into the Fish River Canyon, exploring the world's biggest sand dunes, observing unique marine and birdlife on an ocean cruise, exploring Sandwich Harbour, tracking desert adapted elephant, exploring the world's largest collection of Bushman rock petroglyphs and tracking Africa's famous big game species on game drives in the Etosha Park.

Day 2

Fish River Lodge, Fish River Canyon



Carving out an epic rocky wonderland in the south of Namibia, the Fish River has created Africa's largest and the world's second largest canyon. Hot, dry and stony, the Fish River Canyon measures a whopping 160 kilometres in length, at times 27 kilometres in width and 550 metres in depth. The awe-inspiring natural beauty of this ancient geological marvel draws visitors from around the globe.

Day Itinerary

Meet your guide after breakfast for a transfer to the Eros Airport in the city (10 min). At Eros Airport your guide will assist with the boarding formalities for your light aircraft flight to the Fish River Canyon, the second biggest canyon on Earth. Enjoy a private flight to the Fish River Canyon. Spend 2 nights at a luxury eco lodge located on the canyon rim with breath-

taking views into the canyon. This afternoon you will enjoy a guided scenic drive along the rim of the canyon and enjoy sundowners at a scenic viewpoint. Return to the lodge after sunset and have time to freshen up. Meet for pre-dinner drinks followed by dinner.

Overnight: Fish River Lodge **View iBrochure**

The Fish River Lodge is the only lodge perched directly on the rim of the Fish River Canyon offering guests breath-taking views of the canyon from sunrise to sunset. Experience first-hand the geological forces that unfolded 300 million years ago, when the Fish River began to etch its way through hard quartzite forming a Canyon 90-kilometre long, 549 metres deep and 28 kilometres wide in some places, making it the world's second largest Canyon. The 45 000-hectare Canyon Nature Park is a natural sanctuary for Karoo succulent flora and endemic wildlife.

Each chalet has a separate shower, dressing facility, double basins, toilet and fan whilst an additional outdoor shower offers a chance to cool down under the stars on warm nights. An outdoor 'bed' is available to guests who would like.

Day Itinerary

After breakfast we depart on an exhilarating 4x4 adventure into the canyon. As much as this is an adventure and a scenic drive, it is also an educational experience that will give you an insight into the formation of the canyon 500 million years ago, along with info about the surrounding wildlife and vegetation. Enjoy a picnic lunch inside the canyon. Make sure to pack your bathing suit as you will also have the opportunity to have a refreshing swim in the rock pools on the canyon floor. Return to the lodge in the late afternoon and have time to relax. The lodge also has a variety of hiking trails along the canyon rim that are self-guided.

Day 4

Namib Outpost, Sossusvlei



Located in the scenic Namib-Naukluft National Park, Sossusvlei is where you will find the iconic red sand dunes of the Namib. The clear blue skies contrast with the giant red dunes to make this one of the most scenic natural wonders of Africa and a photographer's heaven. This awe-inspiring destination is possibly Namibia's premier attraction, with its unique dunes rising to almost 400 metres-some of the highest in the world.

These iconic dunes come alive in morning and evening light and draw photography enthusiasts from around the globe. Sossusvlei is home to a variety desert wildlife including oryx, springbok, ostrich and a variety of reptiles.

Visitors can climb 'Big Daddy', one of Sossusvlei's tallest dunes; explore Deadvlei, a white salt claypan dotted with ancient trees; or for the more extravagant, scenic flights and hot air ballooning are on offer, followed by a once-in-a-lifetime champagne breakfast amidst these majestic dunes.

Day Itinerary

Meet your guide after breakfast for a transfer to the landing strip. Depart the Fish River Canyon on your private light aircraft flight to the Sossusvlei area of the Namib Desert. You

will see the landscape change from one extreme to the next; barren canyons and gorges, mountains, open plains, and sand dunes. Here you will spend 2 nights surrounded by the peace, tranquillity and breath-taking beauty of the oldest desert on earth. In the late afternoon we depart on a guided nature drive into the desert and enjoy sundowner drinks and snacks at a scenic location.

Your guide will educate you on the surrounding desert landscape. Return to the lodge after sunset. After dinner you can do some stargazing from the lodge observatory under the guidance of a professional astronomer.

Overnight: Namib Outpost [View iBrochure](#)

The Namib Outpost is located in the Namib Tsaris Nature Reserve, a private nature reserve that is dedicated to protecting the unique and fragile desert environment. Namib Outpost lies well off the main roads with views into the world-famous Namib- Naukluft National Park, home to the Namib Sand Sea, a UNESCO World Heritage Site which includes Sossusvlei, Deadvlei, Dune 45 and the Sesriem Canyon.

The lodge offers relaxed hospitality with a natural atmosphere. On the wide open desert plains, wildlife, roaming the endless grasslands, can sometimes be observed. Various activities are offered to the guests: Excursions to Sossusvlei, as well as horseback safaris, sundowner drives and hikes. The new Massage Lounge is a wonderful addition to the Lodge and offers a carefully selected choice relaxing of massages.

Return to the lodge for lunch and time to relax. The lodge has a variety of excellent facilities available. In the late afternoon you will enjoy a sunset excursion. Return to the lodge after sunset for dinner and relaxation.

Sossusvlei

Deadvlei

Deadvlei is a clay pan near Sossusvlei, marked by dark, dead camel thorn trees standing on a pale, cracked surface. These trees grew after flooding by the Tsauchab River, but shifting dunes later cut off the water. The arid climate has preserved the trees for centuries.

Surrounded by rust-coloured dunes and a vivid sky, the area presents a stark, striking contrast that draws many to observe its unique and silent landscape.

Sesriem Canyon

Sesriem Canyon is a captivating natural wonder located in the heart of the Namib Desert in Namibia. Carved over millions of years by the Tsauchab River, this narrow gorge is a testament to the power of erosion. The name Sesriem comes from the Afrikaans and Dutch words for six leather straps, which early pioneers used tied together to draw water from the deep pools within the canyon. Sesriem Canyon is not only a geological marvel but also a haven for unique desert flora and fauna, making it a popular stop for tourists exploring the surreal landscapes of the Namib Desert.

Namib Sky Balloon Safaris

Situated in the heart of the Namib Naukluft Park, Sossusvlei, one of the most fascinating landscapes in Namibia, is a photographer's dream. Gigantic orange dunes, dramatic shadows, undulating plains and Rocky Mountains create a magical kaleidoscope of colours and shapes. To the east, Namib Rand Nature Reserve vast sandy plains are surrounded by towering granite mountains and rolling dunes.

Here, in the oldest desert on the planet, amazingly adapted animals and plants come together to form one of the most visually stunning ecosystems in the world. And truly the best way to experience the heart of the Namib desert is with a hot air balloon safari.

Watching the spectacular sunrise over this magnificent landscape from a silent hot air balloon is the experience of a lifetime, never to be forgotten. At landing, you come back to earth with an "Out Of Africa" style breakfast set up in the middle of nowhere. Your pilot will present you with a flight certificate before you take a leisurely nature drive back to the pick-up point.

Day 6

Swakopmund Guesthouse, Swakopmund



Set along Namibia's spectacularly scenic coast, the seaside town of Swakopmund is known for its wide-open avenues, colonial architecture, and is surrounded by otherworldly desert terrain. Founded in 1892 as the main harbour for German South West Africa, Swakopmund is often described as being more German than Germany. Now a seaside resort town, Swakopmund is the capital of the Skeleton Coast tourism area and has plenty to keep visitors happy. The quirky mix of German and Namibian influences, adventure options, laidback atmosphere and cool sea breeze make it very popular Namibian destination.

Day Itinerary

Due to the private aircraft, the departure time is somewhat flexible. Board your private light aircraft with your guide for a scenic flight across the Namib Desert towards the Skeleton Coast and Swakopmund. Most of the flight is over the Namib, the oldest desert on earth. On this exceptional scenic flight, you might also see deserted desert mining camps surrounded by a sea of sand.

The flight will give you a spectacular aerial perspective of the Namib that the general visitor to Namibia do not see. Upon arrival in Swakopmund, have time to settle into your hotel. Rest of afternoon free to explore this beautiful desert oasis town. We spend the next 2 nights in Swakopmund. The town also has a great variety of shops, boutiques, restaurants, bars, cafes and beaches.

Overnight: Swakopmund Guesthouse

Meet your guide after breakfast. Today you will explore both the Atlantic Ocean and Namib Desert. Start the day with an ocean dolphin and seal boat cruise. You will also enjoy some sparkling wine and Namibian oysters.

After the boat cruise hop onto the 4x4 for an excursion through the Namib Desert and onwards to Sandwich Harbour. Sandwich Harbour is an important wetland wedged between the ocean and desert sand dunes, one of Namibia's most unique and isolated attractions.

Return to the hotel in the afternoon for time to relax or maybe enjoy a spa treatment. Your guide will assist with a dinner reservation at one of the many excellent Swakopmund restaurants.

Day 8

Camp Kipwe, Twyfelfontein



Set in the Kunene Region of north-western Namibia, Twyfelfontein is a spectacularly scenic area, featuring one of the largest and most important concentrations of rock art in Africa. The name 'Twyfelfontein' translates to 'Fountain of Doubt', which refers to the perennial spring situated in the impressive Huab Valley flanked by the slopes of a sandstone Table Mountain.

It was this spring that attracted Stone Age hunters over six thousand years ago, and it was during this time that the extensive group of rock engravings and paintings were produced. Visitors can look forward to basing themselves at some wonderfully shady campsites along the Aba-Huab riverbed, while exploring over thirty different sacred ritual sites of the traditional hunter-gatherer communities.

Day Itinerary

Meet your guide after breakfast for your transfer to the Swakopmund Airport where your private aircraft is waiting. Your guide will finalize boarding procedures for your light aircraft charter flight to Damaraland. The flight takes you from the coast past the famous Brandberg, Namibia's biggest freestanding mountain. Your guide will point out the Brandberg.

We spend 2 nights in Damaraland, one of the most beautiful areas in Namibia. Lunch will be served at the camp. Your stay is fully inclusive of all meals & beverages, all activities, and park & conservation fees. Activities include; excursion to the Twyfelfontein Bushman engravings, the Burnt Mountain and Organ Pipes, tracking desert adapted elephants and visiting the Damaraland Living Museum.

This afternoon you will enjoy a visit to Twyfelfontein Bushman Engravings (UNESCO World Heritage Site), the Burnt Mountain and the Organ Pipes. Refreshments included. Return to the lodge at sunset.

Activities

Twyfelfontein Rock Art

Twyfelfontein Rock Art

Twyfelfontein is a World Heritage Site boasting one of the richest rock art concentrations in Africa. Thousands of tourists come to this site each year to view some 2, 500 Stone Age rock

engravings. The area is home to 17 rock art sites, which collectively encompass 212 engraved stone slabs. There are an additional 13 sites displaying rock paintings.



Overnight: Camp Kipwe [View iBrochure](#)

Camp Kipwe is an intimate and remote bush lodge located in Namibia's arid yet starkly beautiful Twyfelfontein region, home to many ancient Bushman etchings. The 9 specially-designed bungalows are unique, air conditioned and round in shape, complete with an open-air bathroom and spectacular views from your verandah over the surrounding area.

The Kipwe Suite is a thatched suite with a lounge equipped with air-conditioning, a satellite television, a double room with en-suite bathroom, laundry service and a mini-bar. The 2 Luxury Suites are elevated atop the kopje and benefit from sweeping views across either east or west across the landscape. Complete with lounge, bedroom, and ensuite bathroom before spilling out on a large deck with heated splash pool, sala and sunbeds.

Camp Kipwe offers guided nature walks around the Twyfelfontein Conservancy, as well as trips to see the Bushman etchings, the mysterious Organ Pipes and Burnt Mountain. For a very special experience, an Elephant Nature Drive is a must-do; explore the terrain in search of these elusive desert-dwelling elephants who have adapted to the dry and sandy conditions of northern Namibia.



Bungalows

The twin-bedded bungalows are in the shape of rondavels and have boulder, cement and rock walls ensuring that on entry, feel like a cool secluded cave with outside decks to admire the view. The en-suite, private bathrooms are built amongst the rocks, allowing guests to take advantage of the outdoor weather. Hot water is supplied by wood-burning 'donkey' boilers and solar geysers.

Depending on the location of the elephants, we might take a packed lunch with us in order to spend more time tracking, or we might return to the lodge in time for lunch.

Day 10**Etosha King Nehale, Etosha East**

Located in North-western Namibia, Etosha East is a protected sanctuary in the eastern part of the world-renowned Etosha National Park, known as one of the most accessible game reserves in Southern Africa. Etosha East boasts vast open plains scattered with semi-arid savannah grasslands dotted with watering holes and secluded bush camps. An impressive 5000-square-kilometre Etosha salt pan makes up a large area of the eastern side of the park and can even be seen from space. This remote area teems with abundant wildlife such as lions, elephants, black rhinos and giraffes, as well as a variety of birdlife featuring flamingos, ostriches, eagles, hornbills, and owls.

Day Itinerary

No need to depart early as we have a private aircraft, so departure time is as flexible as possible. Today we head north to the Etosha National Park where we spend 3 nights. The area is known for prime game viewing. Upon arrival at the airstrip we get transferred to the lodge. Have time to settle in and enjoy lunch. Later this afternoon you will enjoy a safari activity; guided game drive. Return to the lodge around sunset for dinner and relaxation.

Overnight: Etosha King Nehale [View iBrochure](#)

Etosha King Nehale has been designed and decorated to pay homage to the cultural heritage of the area and the majestic riches of the Etosha animal kingdom. Guests are captivated by the fascinating atmosphere and warm cordiality that arises from the great attention to detail, whether in the interior design, the choice of food and other details.

The Lodge is situated on the Andoni Plains, one kilometre from Etosha's northern King Nehale Gate and only 48 kilometres north of Namutoni. At this welcoming lodge each of the 40 spacious chalets has its own plunge pool and views over the plains. Etosha King Nehale has private access to a remote waterhole in Etosha National Park where the lodge has established its Ontalelo Outpost. The name says it all: ontalelo meaning "view, sight", "outpost" describes a remote part of a kingdom or empire.

Guests can enjoy the fascinating experience of being close to the wonders of Etosha's animal kingdom. To the north, the pulsating cultural vibrancy of the communal areas of the Oshikoto, Oshana, Ohangwena and Omusati regions awaits visitors. Location: 1 km north of the King Nehale Gate outside the Etosha National Park

Day 11**Etosha King Nehale, Etosha East****Day Itinerary**

We head out on a full day game drive around sunrise. You will spend the day tracking wildlife in the famous Etosha National Park. Return to the lodge in the late afternoon.

2. Deposit Payment

A non-refundable deposit of 50% of the full amount is required at the time of booking, with the balance to be paid not later than 60 days prior to departure of the tour. The following exceptions will apply: 1. Should any of the supplier's conditions vary from the above terms and conditions. 2. Should bookings be made less than 60 days prior to arrival full payment is required immediately.

3. Cancellation by traveller

The date of cancellation shall be the date on which the written notification is received by the Fly in Safari Co.
