

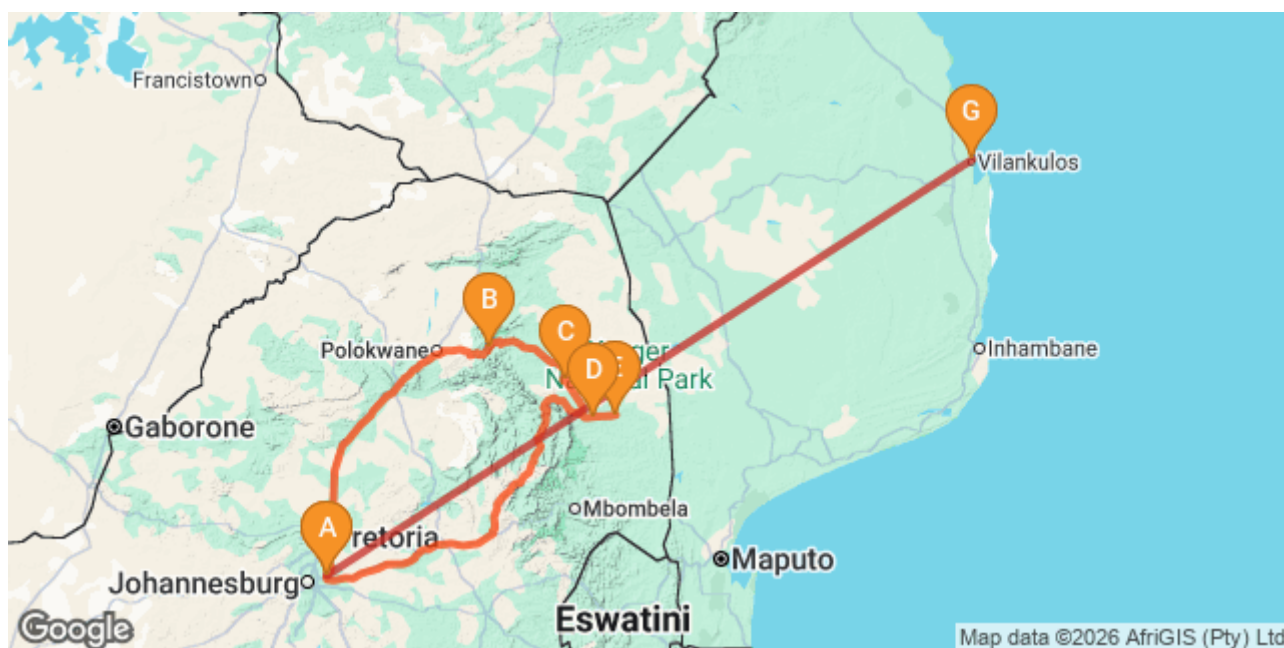

Introduction

This 14 Day Kruger to Coast Explorer conveniently starts and ends in Johannesburg, South Africa, and is inclusive of a private guide and transport (day 1 - 10), most meals, hand-picked accommodation options, the most important activities, all park, entry & conservation fees, and all regional flights between Hoedspruit and Johannesburg, and between South Africa and Mozambique.

The tour starts with a visit to the Magoebaskloof Mountains in South Africa's Limpopo Province. Here you will experience spectacular natural mountain and forest scenery with the option to glide through treetop canopies surrounded by waterfalls.

From Magoebaskloof the tour continues to the Greater Kruger National Park where you will visit two private concessions that border the Kruger National Park. In the private Kruger Reserves, you will stay in small and intimate tented safari camps and enjoy daily open vehicle game drives with professional guides and trackers in search of Africa's iconic wildlife species.

The advantage of the private concessions is that no other visitors are allowed inside these reserves, offering you a private and exclusive safari experience away from the crowds. In the private concessions, you also have the advantage of doing night game drives.

To break up the safari experience, you will also enjoy a guided boat cruise on the Blyde River Dam to see the Blyde River Canyon & Three Rondavels, and visit a traditional Shangaan village for a guided walk through the village to experience rural life in South Africa.

The tour ends with a 3-night stay in Mozambique's breathtaking Bazaruto Archipelago, where you can laze on some of Africa's most beautiful beaches, enjoy snorkelling, and island exploration.

Day 1

City Lodge at OR Tambo International Airport, Johannesburg



Johannesburg is one of Africa's largest and most vibrant cities. It is an economic powerhouse in Africa and the gateway to Southern Africa. Day Itinerary

Upon arrival at OR Tambo International Airport, you will be met by a Fly in Safari Co. representative as you get off the aircraft, unless you must take a bus to the terminal, then as you get off the bus. You will be escorted to immigration, luggage collection, and handed over to your guide at arrivals. A short walk to your hotel situated at the airport. Your guide will assist you with check-in procedures and make sure you settle in. Later in the afternoon you will meet your guide for a pre-departure meeting. Evening to be spent at one's own leisure.

Day 2

Magoebaskloof Ruskamp The Mountain Lodge, Magoebaskloof

Day Itinerary

Depart Johannesburg and head north into the Limpopo Province. Our destination is the beautiful Magoebaskloof (376km; 4 hours). Magoebaskloof is a lush green mountainous area, covered by natural evergreen subtropical forest. This is one of the lushest and scenically beautiful regions of South Africa.

Before reaching Magoebaskloof, we stop at the small village of Haenertsburg, a quaint village situated on the edge of the Great Escarpment.

Have some time to browse the village's lovely shops, including arts and crafts, books, curios, fresh produce, antiques, and collectibles. There are also a few bistros and the iconic village pub named after Iron Crown, the district's highest peak.

We check into our accommodation in the late afternoon and have time to relax.

Haenertsburg

Set on the slopes of the Great Escarpment in the Limpopo Province, between Polokwane and Tzaneen, the picture-perfect village of Haenertsburg is blanketed in bright green forests, shrouded in mists and home to bright pink, purple and orange flowers. Here, the highest tree in South Africa, a Blue Gum tree standing at 82,5 metres high, makes its home, and one of the steepest mountain passes in the country, the Magoebaskloof pass, offers a dramatic hike for outdoor enthusiasts. A wealth of mountain biking, horse-riding and 4x4 trails wind through indigenous grasslands, and several gorgeous dams are filled with trout. Historic attractions include a memorial dedicated to famous Scottish writer John Buchan who once lived here, and a War Memorial commemorating those who lost their lives in the Makgoba War. Make sure to try the delicious traditionally-made cheese at Wegraakbosch Dairy.

Day 3**Bundox Explorer Camp, Balule Private Game Reserve**

Situated in the Limpopo Province and forming part of the Greater Kruger National Park in north-eastern South Africa, the Balule Private Game Reserve is known for its abundant free-roaming wildlife, fascinating birdlife and is home to the renowned Big Five, which includes lion, elephant, rhino, buffalo, and leopard. While the big game is the undoubtable highlight of the reserve, visitors can also look forward to spotting an array of other African wildlife such as a variety of buck, zebra, giraffe, wildebeest and over 250 bird species living amongst the savannah, riverine forest and wooded mountains. Other popular activities include: boating down the Olifants River on an exciting water safari, visiting a cultural village, or horse riding, white water rafting and hot air ballooning through this spectacular landscape.

Day Itinerary

Morning free for an optional Canopy Tour. This is an adventure into a previously inaccessible realm of nature, as you traverse the upper level of indigenous forest and ancient mountain cliffs, overlooking the spectacular Groot Letaba River gorge. The tour includes awe-inspiring slides and platform viewpoints over three giant waterfalls, each tumbling up to 20 meters into the sparkling river below.

We depart Magoebaskloof and head to our next destination, a small, intimate and authentic tented safari camp nestled in a private concession within the Greater Kruger's Oliphant's West Game Reserve. Oliphant's West Game Reserve is a section of the Balule Private Game Reserve. We reach our camp in the early afternoon and have time to settle in.

Your stay includes all meals at the camp, all professionally guided open vehicle game drives, drinking water, sundowner drink and snacks on sunset game drives and all park & conservation fees.

Meetup with your guide later in the afternoon for the sunset game drive. The area is home to all of Africa's famous big game species, a huge variety of antelope and many bird species. We also stop for a sundowner drink and snacks at a scenic location before heading back to camp.

Have time to freshen up before dinner is served. After dinner we meet at the campfire to talk about the happenings of the day, and share stories.

Your stay in the Balule Private Reserve includes 2x safari tents; 2x adults sharing one tent, 2x kids sharing one tent.

Day 6

Scattered along the unfenced western boundary of the world-renowned Kruger National Park, private game reserves combine with the Kruger to establish one of the world's largest game reserves. This incredible destination offers visitors excellent Big Five game viewing opportunities and an array of luxury safari accommodation complete with world-class cuisine, relaxing spas and private pools. Visitors can look forward to fascinating night-drive safaris, guided nature walks, and open-top safari adventures. Some of these prestigious private reserves include: Sabi Sands Private Game Reserve, Thornybush Private Game Reserve, and Timbavati Private Game Reserve, to name a few.

Day Itinerary

We depart the Balule Reserve and drive south towards the Blyde River Canyon. You will be able to see the mountains of the Blyde River Canyon in the background. The Blyde River Canyon is the source of the Drakensberg Mountains, South Africa's biggest mountain range. We make our way to the base of the Blyde River Canyon where you will enjoy a 90-minute boat cruise on the Blyde Dam.

As much as the boat cruise is an adventure, it is also an educational experience. You will learn about the formation of the Blyde River Canyon (3rd largest in the world), the resident wildlife and also see the rare living Kadishi Tufa Waterfall and Three Rondavels.

After the boat cruise we head to our destination for the day, a safari lodge located near one of the entrance gates of the Kruger National Park. Rest of afternoon free to relax.

Overnight: Timbavati Safari Lodge

Timbavati Safari Lodge is situated near the renowned Kruger National Park in South Africa, nestled among mature indigenous trees. The lodge offers a variety of accommodation

options, including colourful Ndebele rondavels and luxury glamping tents, all equipped with the necessary amenities for a comfortable stay. Guests can enjoy delicious meals at the on-site restaurant, relax by the swimming pool, and unwind by the bar. On the property, guests can enjoy guided game drives, bird watching, and nature walks to explore the rich wildlife and scenic beauty of the park.

Day 7

Khoka Moya Tented Camp, Manyeleti Private Game Reserve



The Manyeleti Private Game Reserve shares its borders with Kruger National Park, Timbavati Game Reserve and Sabi Sands Game Reserve, forming part of a huge area of land in which wildlife roams free. It is managed by the Mnisi people, who have lived on this land for many generations. In Shangaan, the language of the most dominant tribe in the area, Manyeleti means 'Place of Stars' and in the evenings, when the sun's light is replaced by that of the moon and countless bright stars, one can understand why. A dry area for most of the year, Manyeleti offers spectacular scenes of wildlife as they gather at water holes. Aside from the spectacular game viewing opportunities, the reserve also offers insight into the culture and traditions of the Mnisi people.

Day Itinerary

After breakfast you will enjoy a guided “Cultural Village Walk” and experience a personal and close up look at how many of the rural people in South Africa live and survive. The local Shangaan village of “Sigagule” is a unique place to visit, talk to the people, take photos, and witness for yourself, traditional life, in a rural village.

You will stroll through the village with a local guide for about 1 ½ – 2 hours. The guide will inform you of the traditions and culture of the people as you walk, stopping to take photographs when you want, and point out places and things of interest. During the walk you will visit the “Sangoma” (traditional healer), a family home, the clinic, the local trading store and tavern. A visit to the Sihlekisi School and crèche is also made if time permits for the extra walk to the far end of the village.

After the village tour we make our way to our next destination, an authentic tented safari camp in the private Manyeleti Reserve that shares an unfenced border with the Kruger National Park (30 minutes). Upon arrival at the camp, have time to settle in and enjoy lunch. After lunch you have time to relax.

In the late afternoon we depart on an open vehicle game drive in the private Kruger Park concession. The area is home to all of Africa's iconic big game species. Due to the location inside the private concession, game drives can also carry on until after dark. In the Private Manyeleti Reserve the family will share a safari tent consisting of 1x double bed and 2x single beds.

Timbavati Safari Lodge Shangaan Cultural Village Tour offers visitors a step into a truly African cultural village experience. The tour features a guided walk for approximately 2½ hours visiting and meeting the local people in the area, a visit to the local clinic, a local trading store, school, the homes of the local people, and a visit to the local herbal and spiritual doctor.



Overnight: Khoka Moya Tented Camp

Bordering the Kruger National Park, between Timbavati and Sabi Sands lies Manyeleti Game Reserve. This is home to Honeyguides two tented camps, Mantobeni & Khoka Moya.

Under the profound knowledge and experience of our rangers and trackers you are guaranteed an unforgettable wildlife experience, including the Big Five, superb cuisine and service excellence.

Khoka Moya Camp is situated on both sides of a river bed and offers an authentic African experience without sacrificing luxury, safety or comfort. Each of the 15 tents are furnished in a comfortable, contemporary style with king sized beds and en-suite bathrooms.

Children of all ages are welcome and babysitting can be arranged with advance notice.



Luxury Tents

There are 15 large tents furnished in a comfortable, contemporary style. Each tent has king sized beds (can be converted to twins if required) and a large size day bed. The tents are en-suite with double showers, his & her basins and a separate toilet. The tents measure 60 square metres and can comfortably accommodate families of four, all protected with mosquito nets.

Day 8

Khoka Moya Tented Camp, Manyeleti Private Game Reserve

Day Itinerary

Wakeup call is at 6am. The morning game drive departs at 06h30 am. Typically, the drive starts by looking for tracks and signs of wildlife activity from the evening before. This will give your guides indication on which direction to follow.

The area is a wildlife rich Big Five area and home to all of Africa's famous big game species, a huge variety of antelope species and roughly 500 bird species. The Greater Kruger National Park is one of the most diverse wildlife areas in Africa due to the incredible variety of habitats and its sheer size. None of the wildlife in the private concession are fenced in as it shares an unfenced border with the main Kruger National Park that encompass more than 2 million hectares.

After the morning drive you will return to camp for some rest. In between game drives you have time to relax at the camp making use of the excellent facilities; swimming pool, spa, lounges, decks etc. With the camp being unfenced, don't be surprised if you spot a hyena or elephant passing through camp, or hear the roar of a lion nearby.

The afternoon game drive departs at 15h30. As with the morning drive, on afternoon drives you will also track wildlife with your guides. It is common for wildlife to gather around the waterholes in the late afternoon. Return to camp around sunset for time to freshen up before dinner.

In the Private Manyeleti Reserve the family will share a safari tent consisting of 1x double bed and 2x single beds.

Day 9

Day Itinerary

Wakeup call is at 6am. The morning game drive departs at 06h30 am. Typically, the drive starts by looking for tracks and signs of wildlife activity from the evening before. This will give your guides indication on which direction to follow.

The area is a wildlife rich Big Five area and home to all of Africa's famous big game species, a huge variety of antelope species and roughly 500 bird species. The Greater Kruger National Park is one of the most diverse wildlife areas in Africa due to the incredible variety of habitats and its sheer size. None of the wildlife in the private concession are fenced in as it shares an unfenced border with the main Kruger National Park that encompass more than 2 million hectares.

After the morning drive you will return to camp for some rest. In between game drives you have time to relax at the camp making use of the excellent facilities; swimming pool, spa, lounges, decks etc. With the camp being unfenced, don't be surprised if you spot a hyena or elephant passing through camp, or hear the roar of a lion nearby.

The afternoon game drive departs at 15h30. As with the morning drive, on afternoon drives you will also track wildlife with your guides. It is common for wildlife to gather around the waterholes in the late afternoon. Return to camp around sunset for time to freshen up before dinner.
