To guarantee exclusivity, easy flowing logistics from start to finish of the tour, and attention to detail, this tour is professionally guided by a professional expedition leader. The tour visits four countries; South Africa, Botswana, Zambia and Kenya.

As this is a Fly in Safari Tour™, you are guaranteed to have short travel days for the majority of the tour, and spend the maximum amount of time at the magical destinations you will visit. Flights between countries are scheduled regional flights, while flights between safari camps are scenic light aircraft charter flights.

Highlights include Cape Town, the Okavango Delta, Chobe National Park, Victoria Falls and the Masai Mara National Reserve (Private Conservancy). The tour has the focus on the Natural Wonders and wildlife regions you will visit, for this reason the majority of the accommodations are located within National Parks or Private Wildlife Concessions. National Parks and Reserves you will visit include; Table Mountain National Park, Cape Point Nature Reserve, Moremi Game Reserve (Okavango Delta), Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park and the Masai Mara National Reserve (Mara Naboisho Private Conservancy).

All activities are professionally guided and highlights include; Cape Town - South Africa (Table Mountain, Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens, Constantia Winelands, the Cape Peninsula), Okavango Delta - Botswana (game drives and boat cruises in the Moremi Game Reserve), Chobe National Park - Botswana (River Safari), Livingstone - Zambia (Victoria Falls, Zambezi cruise, Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park) and Masai Mara - Kenya (Mara Naboisho Private Conservancy).

To guarantee exclusivity in the Masai Mara, you will stay in a private conservancy to avoid the crowds. During migration season (July to September) you will also venture into the main Masai Mara National Reserve. Your stay in the Mara also includes a visit to a Maasai village where you can meet and interact with the Masai people.

The tour includes the services of a professional guide, private transport for activities in Cape Town, most meals & beverages (alcoholic & non-alcoholic), all activities, all light aircraft flights between camps, regional flights between Southern & East Africa, all transfers, laundry services and all park, entry & conservation fees.

It is only a short drive to the Table Mountain cable station from where you will enjoy a cableway ride to the top of Table Mountain, Cape Town's most prominent landmark. Your guide will take you on a guided walk to the various viewpoints on top of the mountain and enlighten you about the formation about the mountain, one of the oldest mountains on earth.

On top of the mountain, you can enjoy spectacular views of the city, Robben Island, the Cape Peninsula and Table Bay. After visiting Table Mountain it's only a short drive to the Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens where you will take a scenic walk along the Boomslang Treetop Canopy Walkway to take in the spectacular views of the world's most unique

Botanical Garden. Next we visit the Constantia Winelands for a gourmet lunch and wine tasting at one of the exclusive wine estates. Return to your hotel in the late afternoon for some relaxation.

Table Mountain

Table Mountain is the most iconic landmark of South Africa. Aside from being the country's most photographed attraction and the perfect place to take photos of the landscape of Cape Town, it is also home to about 2,200 species of plants and 1,470 floral species, many of which are endemic to the mountain. Animal species that can be spotted on the mountain include caracals, rock hyraxes and chacma baboons. The flat top peak of the mountain reaches 1,086 metres above sea level, but being so close to the sea and to the city, its features look more imposing.



Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens

Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens is a botanical paradise nestled at the eastern foot of Table Mountain in Cape Town, South Africa. Spanning over 36 hectares, it showcases a stunning array of indigenous plants, including a vast collection of fynbos, cycads, and proteas. Visitors can explore its well-maintained pathways, which lead to various themed gardens, including a fragrance garden and a medicinal garden. Kirstenbosch is not only a botanical wonderland but also a hub for cultural events and live music concerts, offering a unique blend of nature and entertainment in a truly breathtaking setting.



Beau Constantia

Situated at the top of Constantia Nek, overlooking False Bay, Beau Constantia is renowned for its high-altitude vineyards and meticulously crafted wines. Guests can enjoy wine tastings in the tasting room or on the open-air patio. Ivor's unique take on the classic Chefs Warehouse set menu is both personality-driven and seasonal.

Day 4**Camp Moremi, Moremi Game Reserve**

Situated in the east of the Okavango Delta, Moremi Game Reserve ranks as one of the most beautiful reserves in Africa. It covers more than 4871 square kilometers of pristine wilderness, and the varied terrain includes savannah, winding waterways, and dense forest. This diverse ecosystem supports an incredibly wide spectrum of wildlife, ranging from large herds of buffalo, wildebeest and zebra, to the rare sitatunga and lechwe antelope, lion, cheetah and packs of wild dog in the open grasslands. The birdlife is prolific and includes most of the 550 bird species recorded on Botswana's national bird list.

Day Itinerary

An early morning transfer to the Cape Town International Airport. Your guide will assist with check in and boarding procedures for your flight to Maun, Botswana. Upon arrival at Maun Airport your guide will assist with customs & immigration procedures, and the procedures to board your scheduled light aircraft flight into the Moremi Game Reserve, Okavango Delta.

Upon arrival at the airstrip in the Moremi Game Reserve, the open game viewer will be waiting next to the airstrip. You will enjoy your first Moremi game drive from the airstrip to the safari camp. Upon arrival at camp have time to settle in and freshen up.

In the late afternoon you will enjoy high tea before departing on the sunset game drive. The Moremi is Botswana's premier game reserve and home to an astonishing variety of Africa's big game such as lion, leopard, elephant, buffalo, giraffe, wild dog, hyena, zebra, wildebeest, a wide variety of antelope and abundant bird species.

Enjoy sundowner snacks and drinks at a scenic location in the reserve before heading back to camp after sunset. Have time to freshen up before enjoying pre-dinner drinks followed by dinner.

Day 7

Chobe Game Lodge, Chobe River Front



The Chobe River forms the northern boundary of the Chobe National Park, renowned for its diverse and abundant game viewing opportunities. This section of the park is best known for its dense concentration of wildlife including elephant and hippo populations, but the waters attract all manner of game including large herds of buffalo and the lions that prey on them. A visit to this area guarantees close encounters with an array of African wildlife.

Day Itinerary

Breakfast and a game drive transfer to the airstrip. Board a light aircraft charter flight to the Kasane Airport. Upon arrival in Kasane it's only a short road transfer to your accommodation overlooking the Chobe River, Chobe National Park. Have time to settle in and enjoy lunch. In the afternoon meet up with your guide for high tea before departing on a sunset river safari on the Chobe.

Chobe is known as the elephant kingdom of Africa and the Chobe River safari is rated one of the best river safaris in Africa. The cruise is known to offer excellent close up photo opportunities of big game such as elephant, hippo, crocodile and various wildlife species that come to the river edge to drink. Enjoy sundowner snacks and drinks on the river while watching the sunset over the Chobe. Return to the lodge after sunset and have time to freshen up before pre-dinner drinks and dinner.

Counter-balancing the wilderness are restful, air conditioned, en-suite lodgings. Graceful high arches, quarry tiled floors and barrel-vaulted ceilings create an atmosphere of cool tranquillity. Other facilities include a large swimming pool with terrace, a riverside boma area, a stylish bar with an outside terrace, an expansive deck offering magnificent views over the Chobe River as well as conference facilities for business travellers. All meals are catered for in various locations throughout the lodge including the terrace, boma and riverfront deck.

One of the original natural wonders of the world, the Victoria Falls is a World Heritage Site and an extremely popular tourist attraction. Known locally as 'The Smoke that Thunders' this spectacle is accessible from both Zambia and Zimbabwe and it is an ideal place to combine game viewing and water sports. There is excellent fishing, a terrifying bungee jump and arguably the best commercial white-water rafting in the world.

Day Itinerary

If time allows, then you can enjoy one final morning safari activity. Our transfer will meet us at the lodge. It is only a short transfer to the Botswana / Zambia border post. Your guide will assist with border formalities.

The drive from the border to our accommodation takes approximately 40 minutes. Upon arrival at your accommodation on the banks of the Zambezi River have time to settle in and enjoy lunch. Have time to relax and freshen up before departing on a sunset river cruise including snacks & drinks (alcoholic & non-alcoholic). On the cruise it is common to see wildlife such as crocodile, hippo elephant and abundant birdlife. Enjoy a beautiful African sunset while sipping on a refreshing drink and enjoying some snacks. Return to the hotel after sunset. Dinner at the lodge.

Overnight: Waterberry Zambezi Lodge [View iBrochure](#)

Waterberry's scenic position on the banks of the Zambezi, with excellent accommodation and outstanding service, makes it the perfect base for a visit to Victoria Falls while escaping the busy town. Guests can choose between three different accommodation options – bright, individual rooms in the 7-room lodge, a private safari house or a luxury tented woodland site.

Waterberry Lodge on the Zambezi riverbank has spacious sun and dining terraces, a lounge to enjoy the panoramic views, and magnificent gardens with individual cottages dotted around the lawns and along the river. An inviting swimming pool is surrounded by rockery gardens.

The River Farmhouse is a private riverside safari house sleeping up to 10, with magnificent views across the infinity pool to the Zambezi and the national park opposite. The Woodlands Forest Tents set in the shady woods of the conservation area are perfect for birdwatching and relaxing in the peaceful wild.

An international Zambian, German and British team run this independently owned lodge and Waterberry is a proud community partner. Guests are able to witness rural Zambian life first hand, and see how tourism is genuinely giving back with schools, a farming cooperative and adult skills centre.

The Waterberry cottages are set around lawns, gardens and the Zambezi riverbank. Named after birds found around the lodge, these are lovely cool rooms open to the high thatch. All have private terraces and are en-suite with air conditioning, ceiling fan, mosquito nets, private terrace, inside and outside lounge seating, Wifi, toiletries, hairdryer, gowns, water, hand sanitiser. Private dining on the terrace is available on request. The versatile cottages are doubles, twins or triplets with one two-storey family house that is particularly good for families.

Nairobi is Africa's 4th largest city and is a vibrant and exciting place, and although it has developed a reputation which keeps tourist visits brief, there are some fascinating attractions: its cafe culture, unbridled nightlife, the National Museum, the Karen Blixen Museum and most notably just 20 minutes from the city centre wild lions and buffalo roam in the world's only urban game reserve.

Day Itinerary

Today the tour continues to Kenya in East Africa. Transfer from the lodge to the Livingstone International Airport. Your guide will assist with all the check in and boarding procedures for your flight to Nairobi. Upon arrival in Nairobi you will be transferred to your accommodation near the city to get some rest after a long flight from Zambia to Kenya. Due to limited weekly flights from Livingstone to Nairobi, the tour must be planned around available flights.

Overnight: Tamarind Tree Hotel

Tamarind Tree Hotel is ideally located southwest of Nairobi within the spacious Carnivore grounds, offering easy access to the city, Nairobi National Park, and Wilson Airport. The hotel features spacious rooms with modern amenities such as flat-screen TVs, air conditioning, and ensuite bathrooms. (Pty) Ltd will not be held responsible if you are refused entry to a country because you lack the correct visa documentation. The client accepts full responsibility for obtaining all the relevant travel documents required. Should a client be refused entry to any country due to incorrect documentation, the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd will not be liable for any costs of such delays or repatriation cost for the client.

8. Health

It is the responsibility of the client to consult a health professional with respect to recommended and compulsory vaccinations and health pre-cautions. Anti-malaria precautions are recommended for all tours and clients are advised to bring insect repellent.

9. Baggage information

All tours utilizing light aircraft transfers allow a maximum limit of 20 kg baggage per person, soft bags only. The Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd may not be held responsible for any loss or damage to luggage during the tour program. The acceptance of final documents, vouchers or tickets shall be deemed to be consent to the above conditions.

10. Airline responsibility clause

The carriers concerned are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time the passengers are not aboard the aircraft or conveyance. The passenger ticket shall constitute the sole contract between the airline and the passenger. All personal effects and baggage are always the client's responsibility and the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd will not accept liability for any loss or damage to baggage or personal effect.

11. Insurance and Liability

Travel insurance is compulsory for all Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd clients. Your travel insurance must provide cover against personal accident, medical expenses, emergency repatriation and personal liability. We also recommend it covers cancellation, curtailment and loss of luggage and personal effects. We strongly recommend that you take out travel insurance at the time of booking.

(Pty) Ltd act as an tour operator in regard to travel, whether by plane, 4 x 4, car or motor, coach, and assume no liability for injury, damage, loss, accident, delay, war, insurrection, revolt or other civil uprising, other military action, strikes or any Act of God occurring in either the country of origin, destination or through passage, or for any reason whatsoever, or through the acts or default of any company or persons engaged in conveying the passengers or in carrying out arrangements of the tour. They cannot accept any responsibility for losses or additional expenses due to delay or changes in air schedules or other causes. All such losses or expenses will be the responsibility of the member of the tour. The right is reserved to make minor adjustments to the itinerary and the right is reserved to cancel any tour prior to departure.

13. Privacy Policy

13.1 What information do we collect?

We request and collect the following personal information on your booking form after you confirm your tour;

- passport details
- email address, home address and phone number
- contact details of next of kin
- dietary requirements
- medical conditions or allergies
- travel & medical insurance details

13.2 Why do we collect your personal information?

In order to provide our services to you, communicate with you, and to book, finalize and facilitate your tour, we have to collect your personal information.

13.3 How do we use your personal information and who might we share it with?

In order to book, finalize and facilitate your tour, we may, or may not share your details with the service providers involved to make your tour happen. These service providers may, or may not include; airlines, charter companies, accommodation establishments (lodges, hotels and/or guesthouses), ground transportation operators, activity operators, emergency evacuation insurance providers, VIP meet & greet services etc.

13.4 How do we protect your personal information?

We strive to protect your personal information by making use of the following measures;

Encryption

We strive to encrypt all sensitive data, both in transit and at rest, to protect it from unauthorized access.

Strong Passwords and Authentication

We strive to enforce strong password policies and implement multi-factor authentication to prevent unauthorized access to our systems.

Software Updates

We regularly update our system software and related applications to patch security vulnerabilities.

Data Backups

We implement a robust backup and recovery system to ensure data is not lost in case of system failures or security breaches

13.5 Who has access to your personal information?

Only The Fly in safari Company and relevant service providers necessary in order to book and facilitate your tour, will have access to your personal information.

13.6 How long do we retain your personal information?

We will retain your personal information for as long as necessary to fulfil the purpose for which it was collected, but no longer than required by law or for legitimate business purposes. POPIA, the Protection of Personal Information Act, dictates that records should be retained for the period necessary or as authorized by law. Additionally, financial institutions need to retain records related to customer due diligence for at least 5 years from the termination of the business relationship or conclusion of a single transaction, according to the Financial Intelligence Centre Act (FICA).

14. Disclosure

Please be aware that during your participation in this tour certain risks and dangers may arise, including, but not limited to, the hazards of travelling in undeveloped areas, travel by boat, train, automobile, aircraft or other means travelling, the forces of nature, political unrest and accident or illness in remote regions without means of rapid evacuation or medical facilities. Be aware and clearly understand that the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd will not have liability regarding provisions of medical care or the adequacy of any care that may be rendered.

It is understood that the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd will use their best efforts to ensure that all adequate measures are taken to avoid such occurrences. By participating in a Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd tour you hereby agree to accept any risks. As Lawful consideration to the agreement with the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd to participate in such trips and activities, you hereby agree that you will not make a claim against the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd and its employees from all claim actions and demands that you may have for bodily injury, death or property damage arising from your participation in a tour.

Acceptance of the Tour Contract will serve as the release of Liability and Assumption of Risk agreement. This agreement is binding on your heirs, legal representatives and assigns. If any portion is unenforceable, the remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.
