

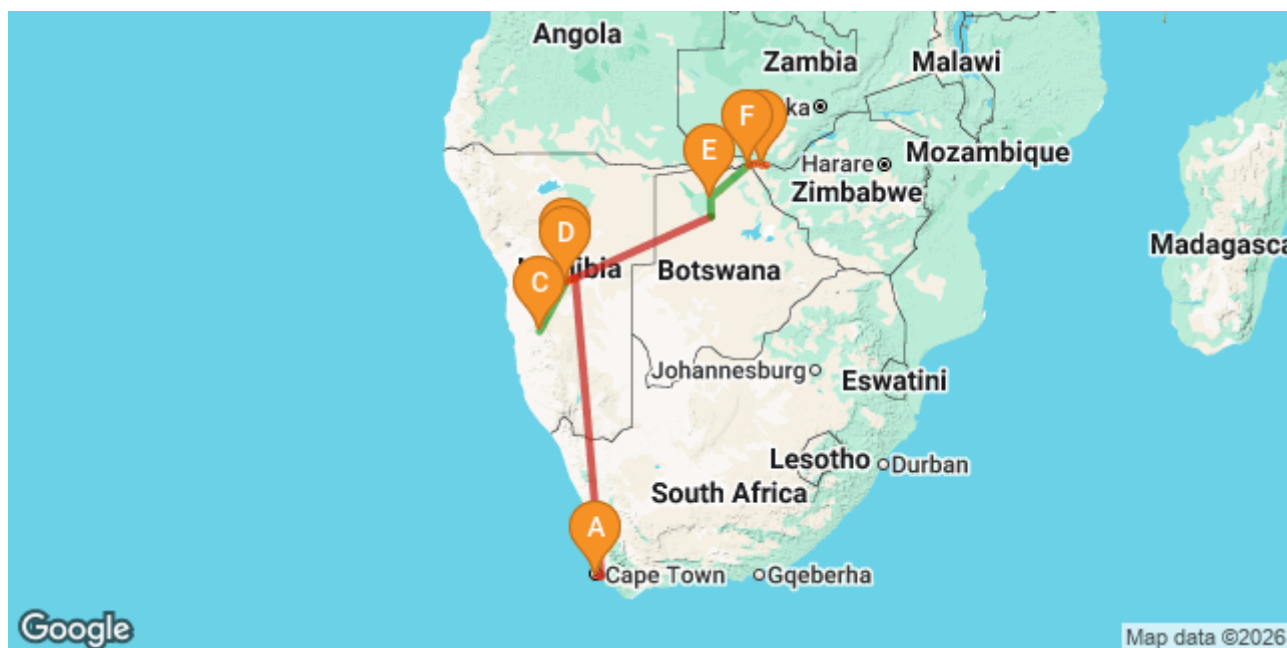

Introduction

Our 14 Day Traverse Southern Africa is one of our guided fly in safari tours and visits 5 highlight destinations in 4 countries; each destination a true representation of its country; Cape Town (South Africa), Sossusvlei (Namib desert Dunes, Namibia), Okavango Delta and Chobe National Park (Botswana) and the Victoria Falls (Zambia).

The tour starts in Cape Town where you spend 3 nights with top highlights including Table Mountain, the Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens and the Boomslang Canopy Walkway, Constantia Winelands and the Cape Peninsula (Chapman's Peak, Cape Point Nature Reserve, Boulders Beach penguin colony).

From Cape Town the tour continues by air to Namibia, where you will stay at a private reserve in central Namibia. here we will go on a game drive to see the endangered white rhino. You will be flown in light aircraft into the Namib, and get to explore Sossusvlei in 4x4 and on foot. You will gaze upon the biggest sand dunes in the world, get to photograph the famous dead trees in Dead Vlei and hike inside a hidden desert canyon to discover a permanent secret water source in one of the world's most barren places.

A short flight takes you from Namibia to Botswana where you will visit the Okavango Delta. The Okavango is one of the most pristine wildlife and nature sanctuaries in the world, a permanent swamp inside the Kalahari. You will explore the Okavango on both land and water activities, and get to come face to face with Africa's famous big game species.

From the Okavango Delta you will fly in light aircraft to the Chobe National Park in the far north of Botswana, known as Africa's elephant kingdom. In the Chobe you will enjoy a river safari, rated one of the best river safaris in Africa and known to offer some of the best close up safari photo opportunities of any African safari.

Your final destination is Livingstone in Zambia where you will be introduced to the country on a welcoming sunset river cruise with excellent photo opportunities. Livingstone is home to the Zambian side of the famous Victoria Falls. In Livingstone you will stay outside the town, away from the constant buzz of helicopters doing scenic flights. All activities are included.

You will explore the Victoria Falls with your guide, cruise on the Zambezi and also have the opportunity for a village visit and to explore the town and markets (your guide will discuss activity options).

The tour includes the services of a professional guide / expedition leader, most meals & beverages (alcoholic & non-alcoholic), all activities, all ground transportation, all scheduled and light aircraft flights, all snacks and drinks on activities, laundry services and all park, entry and conservation fees.

Day Itinerary

Breakfast at the hotel. Meet your guide after breakfast. It's only a short drive to Table Mountain. Enjoy a cable car ride to the top of Table Mountain. Table Mountain stands 1086 meters above sea level. The traditional name of the mountain is 'Hoerikwaggo', meaning 'Mountain in the Sea' in the indigenous Khoi-San language. The mountain literally rises from the sea, a result of continental collision billions of years ago.

At the top of Table Mountain your guide will take you on a walk to the various viewpoints and talk to you about the geology of the mountain and the unique Fynbos vegetation found on the mountain. After spending some time on the mountain, take a cable car to the bottom. Next up we head to the Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens for a guided walk through the gardens. One of the biggest highlights in the garden is the Boomslang Canopy Walkway, which you will visit for some photo opportunities.

Next up we head to a luxury wine estate in the Constantia Winelands, the oldest wine region in the Cape. Here you can enjoy a gourmet lunch with spectacular elevated views of Table Bay and the vineyards below. After lunch, if you feel like it, you can enjoy a wine tasting of the estate wines.

Return to your hotel in the late afternoon for some time to relax before heading out for dinner.

Table Mountain

Table Mountain is the most iconic landmark of South Africa. Aside from being the country's most photographed attraction and the perfect place to take photos of the landscape of Cape Town, it is also home to about 2,200 species of plants and 1,470 floral species, many of which are endemic to the mountain. Animal species that can be spotted on the mountain include caracals, rock hyraxes and chacma baboons. The flat top peak of the mountain reaches 1,086 metres above sea level, but being so close to the sea and to the city, its features look more imposing.



Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens

Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens is a botanical paradise nestled at the eastern foot of Table Mountain in Cape Town, South Africa. Spanning over 36 hectares, it showcases a stunning array of indigenous plants, including a vast collection of fynbos, cycads, and proteas. Visitors can explore its well-maintained pathways, which lead to various themed gardens, including a fragrance garden and a medicinal garden. Kirstenbosch is not only a botanical wonderland but also a hub for cultural events and live music concerts, offering a unique blend of nature and entertainment in a truly breathtaking setting.



Beau Constantia

Situated at the top of Constantia Nek, overlooking False Bay, Beau Constantia is renowned for its high-altitude vineyards and meticulously crafted wines. Guests can enjoy wine tastings in the tasting room or on the open-air patio. The estate also hosts Chefs Warehouse Beau

Day Itinerary

Meet your guide outside the hotel after breakfast. You will be out for most of the day exploring the Cape Peninsula, make sure wear comfortable clothes and walking shoes.

You will circumnavigate the entire Cape Peninsula and visit the many highlights en-route; Hout Bay, Chapman's Peak Drive, Cape Point Nature Reserve (south-western tip of Africa), Boulders Beach Penguin Colony in Simonstown and Kalk Bay.

Return to Cape Town in the late afternoon.

Wildlife enthusiasts can observe the thriving colony of African penguins at Boulders Beach or spot eland, ostrich, and baboons in their natural habitat. With a mix of dramatic landscapes, abundant wildlife, and charming towns, the Cape Peninsula offers unforgettable experiences for adventurers and nature lovers alike.

Day 4

Okapuka Safari Lodge, Central Namibia



Encompassing the bustling capital city of Windhoek, and the laid-back seaside towns of Swakopmund and Walvis Bay, Central Namibia features an array of towns, deserts, and wildlife reserves. The landscape of this region is characterised by grasslands decorated with clusters of Acacia trees, between the Namib Desert to the west and the lush Kalahari to the east. Visitors can soak in the steaming waters of the Cross Barmen Hot Springs, view a wide variety of wildlife, and explore the untouched beauty of the beautiful Erongo Mountains with the breathtakingly beautiful Spitzkoppe, which offers some of the best stargazing opportunities in the country. Divers and snorkellers will enjoy the incredible marine life just

off the coast of Walvis Bay. Art lovers should make sure to visit the little town of Okahandja, famous for its fine wood carving and vibrant markets.

Day Itinerary

Meet your guide after breakfast for a transfer to the Cape Town International Airport. Your guide will assist with checking in and boarding procedures for your flight to Windhoek, Namibia. Upon arrival in Windhoek, we will be transferred to a private 7300 ha game reserve located outside Windhoek.

Have time to settle in and relax. Meet up with your guide in the late afternoon for a sunset game drive. On the game drive we have excellent chances of seeing all of Namibia's indigenous antelope species, giraffe, ostriches and, most importantly, white rhino. Enjoy sundowner snacks & drinks at a scenic location in the reserve before heading back to the lodge for dinner and relaxation.

Day 5

Namib Outpost, Sesriem



As there is no accommodation at Sossusvlei, visitors to this desert wilderness are likely to end up staying at Sesriem, 65 kilometres away, where camps and lodges serve as a base from which to explore the dunes. Sesriem Canyon, a deep chasm carved through the rocks by water, is a striking natural feature of the area that is best explored on foot. Stony walls rise up sharply on both sides of the canyon, while birds roost in its crags and lizards dart along the ledges. The canyon's name was coined when early settlers used it as a water source, using six lengths of leather ('ses riem – six thongs) tied together to lower buckets into the water at the base of canyon.)

Day Itinerary

Meet your guide after breakfast for a transfer to the Eros Airport in Windhoek (30 min). Board a scheduled light aircraft charter flight from Windhoek to the Sossusvlei region of the Namib Desert. Transfer from the airstrip to our accommodation in the Namib Desert. Upon arrival at the lodge have some time to settle in and freshen up before lunch. After lunch have time to relax. Meet up with your guide in the late afternoon for a sunset nature drive, a great introduction to the desert. Enjoy sundowner snacks & drinks at a scenic location in the desert.

Return to the lodge after sunset and have time to freshen up before meeting up for pre-dinner drinks, followed by dinner.

Overnight: Namib Outpost

The Namib Outpost is located in the Namib Tsaris Nature Reserve, a private nature reserve that is dedicated to protecting the unique and fragile desert environment. Namib Outpost lies well off the main roads with views into the world-famous Namib- Naukluft National Park, home to the Namib Sand Sea, a UNESCO World Heritage Site which includes Sossusvlei, Deadvlei, Dune 45 and the Sesriem Canyon.

The lodge offers relaxed hospitality with a natural atmosphere. On the wide open desert plains, wildlife, roaming the endless grasslands, can sometimes be observed. Various activities are offered to the guests: Excursions to Sossusvlei, as well as horseback safaris, sundowner drives and hikes.

The new Massage Lounge is a wonderful addition to the Lodge and offers a carefully selected choice relaxing of massages.

Day 6

Namib Outpost, Sesriem

Day Itinerary

We rise early as we want to enter the Sossusvlei dunes as close to sunrise as possible to take advantage of the beautiful morning light on the red dunes. These red dunes are considered some of the highest sand dunes in the world. At 80 million years old, the Namib is the oldest desert on earth. Oxidation of iron particles in the sand creates the red colour.

A thick sandy track takes us to Sossusvlei where we park the 4x4 and go into the desert on foot. In the early morning the sand is still cool, so its recommended to walk barefoot. Once we get to Deadvlei, you have the option to hike to the top of Big Daddy sand dune, known as one of the highest sand dunes in the world (300 meters).

On a clear day you can spot the Atlantic Ocean from the top of the dune, a view well worth the climb. Alternatively, we spend the next hour or so enjoying the solitude, silence and natural beauty of the Deadvlei clay pan dotted with the famous dead trees.

We leave Deadvlei before the sun and dunes get too hot and make our way to the Sesriem Canyon, an ancient canyon carved out by the Tsauchab River over millions of years. We hike into the canyon and enjoy the cool temperature inside the canyon. It's a short hike through the canyon and your guide will talk more about the formation, history and geography of the canyon.

We head back to the lodge around lunchtime. At the lodge you will have some time to relax. We meet again in the late afternoon for a sunset nature drive.

Sossusvlei

Located in the scenic Namib-Naukluft National Park, Sossusvlei is where you will find the iconic red sand dunes of the Namib. The clear blue skies contrast with the giant red dunes to make this one of the most scenic natural wonders of Africa and a photographer's heaven. This awe-inspiring destination is possibly Namibia's premier attraction, with its unique dunes rising to almost 400 metres-some of the highest in the world.

These iconic dunes come alive in morning and evening light and draw photography enthusiasts from around the globe. Sossusvlei is home to a variety desert wildlife including oryx, springbok, ostrich and a variety of reptiles.

Visitors can climb 'Big Daddy', one of Sossusvlei's tallest dunes; explore Deadvlei, a white salt claypan dotted with ancient trees; or for the more extravagant, scenic flights and hot air ballooning are on offer, followed by a once-in-a-lifetime champagne breakfast amidst these majestic dunes.



Deadvlei

Deadvlei is a clay pan near Sossusvlei, marked by dark, dead camel thorn trees standing on a pale, cracked surface. These trees grew after flooding by the Tsauchab River, but shifting dunes later cut off the water. The arid climate has preserved the trees for centuries. Surrounded by rust-coloured dunes and a vivid sky, the area presents a stark, striking contrast that draws many to observe its unique and silent landscape.

Sesriem Canyon

Sesriem Canyon is a captivating natural wonder located in the heart of the Namib Desert in Namibia. Carved over millions of years by the Tsauchab River, this narrow gorge is a testament to the power of erosion. The name Sesriem comes from the Afrikaans and Dutch words for six leather straps, which early pioneers used tied together to draw water from the deep pools within the canyon. Sesriem Canyon is not only a geological marvel but also a haven for unique desert flora and fauna, making it a popular stop for tourists exploring the surreal landscapes of the Namib Desert.

Day 7

Situated in Central Namibia, the cosmopolitan city of Windhoek serves as the capital of the country. It is home to an international airport and a plethora of restaurants, shops, entertainment venues and accommodation options. The city is clean, safe and well-organised, with a colonial legacy that is reflected in its many German eateries and shops, and the widespread use of the German language. Windhoek has an interesting mix of historical architecture and modern buildings, many of which are worth a look, including the Alte Feste an old fort, the 1896 Christuskirche Christ Church, and the more contemporary Supreme Court.

Day Itinerary

This morning you have the option to do a hot air balloon safari over the Namib (dependent on departure time of charter flight). The safari includes a champagne breakfast in the dunes. Transfer from the lodge to the airstrip. We board a light aircraft charter flight to Windhoek, arriving in the afternoon, where we spend the night. This evening your guide will escort you to one of the local Windhoek restaurants for dinner (own account).

Day 8**Camp Moremi, Moremi Game Reserve**



Situated in the east of the Okavango Delta, Moremi Game Reserve ranks as one of the most beautiful reserves in Africa. It covers more than 4871 square kilometers of pristine wilderness, and the varied terrain includes savannah, winding waterways, and dense forest. This diverse ecosystem supports an incredibly wide spectrum of wildlife, ranging from large herds of buffalo, wildebeest and zebra, to the rare sitatunga and lechwe antelope, lion, cheetah and packs of wild dog in the open grasslands. The birdlife is prolific and includes most of the 550 bird species recorded on Botswana's national bird list.

Day Itinerary

After breakfast we head to the Hosea Kutako International Airport (30mins). We board a scheduled regional flight to Maun, Botswana (1 hour). Upon arrival in Maun, your guide will assist with customs and immigration procedures before we board a short charter flight into the Okavango Delta (20 mins).

Upon arrival in the Moremi Game Reserve, the only proclaimed game reserve inside the Okavango Delta, we are welcomed by our local guide/driver from the camp. The drive from the airstrip to camp will be your first game drive in the Moremi.

Upon arrival at the camp have time to settle in, freshen up and enjoy lunch. After lunch have time to relax. We meet again in the late afternoon for high tea before departing on a sunset game drive. Rated one of Africa's top wildlife sanctuaries, the Moremi Game Reserve teems with big game species such as lion, leopard, elephant, rhino (rare), buffalo, hyenas, painted wolf, giraffe and much more.

We stop at a scenic location for sundowner drinks and snacks. Return to camp after sunset and have time to freshen up before we meet for pre-dinner drinks. Dinner at camp.

Overnight: Camp Moremi [View iBrochure](#)

Recently completely rebuilt, Camp Moremi is located within Botswana's Moremi Game Reserve, situated on the edge of the Xakanaxa Lagoon in an area known for its spectacular game-viewing opportunities. Day 11**Chobe Game Lodge, Chobe River Front**

2. Deposit Payment

A non-refundable deposit of 50% of the full amount is required at the time of booking, with the balance to be paid not later than 60 days prior to departure of the tour. The following exceptions will apply: 1. Should any of the supplier's conditions vary from the above terms and conditions. 2. Should bookings be made less than 60 days prior to arrival full payment is required immediately.

3. Cancellation by traveller

The date of cancellation shall be the date on which the written notification is received by the Fly in Safari Co.
