Introduction

Our 15 Day Great South African Adventure is a professionally guided tour of South Africa. This private small group tour is packed with experiences and destinations that define South Africa as a world-class travel destination.

Highlights include the Manyeleti Private Game Reserve (Kruger National Park), the Blyde River Canyon, the Mpumalanga Highlands (Dullstroom), the Drakensberg Mountains, the Wild Coast & Transkei, the Garden Route, and the Whale Coast. The tour ends in Cape Town.

The tour visits a total of 6 game reserves and national parks: Kruger National Park, Royal Natal National Park, Addo Elephant National Park, Tsitsikamma National Park, Robberg Nature Reserve, and the Garden Route National Park.

Some of the experiences that define this adventure include guided open vehicle game drives in the Manyeleti Private Reserve (Kruger Park), a boat cruise on the Blyde Dam (Blyde River Canyon), hiking in the Royal Natal National Park of the Drakensberg, exploring the beaches of the Wild Coast, experiencing Xhosa culture and traditions, game drives in the Addo Elephant National Park, exploring the Storms River gorge on kayak, hiking in the Robberg Nature Reserve, enjoying a picnic in the winelands, walking among African penguins and laying eyes upon the beautiful Table Mountain to name some.

The tour includes the services of a professional guide, private transport, all activities, meals as per itinerary, all park entrance, and conservation fees.

Day 1

Khoka Moya Tented Camp, Manyeleti Private Game Reserve



The Manyeleti Private Game Reserve shares its borders with Kruger National Park, Timbavati Game Reserve and Sabi Sands Game Reserve, forming part of a huge area of land in which wildlife roams free. It is managed by the Mnisi people, who have lived on this land for many generations.

In Shangaan, the language of the most dominant tribe in the area, Manyeleti means 'Place of Stars' and in the evenings, when the sun's light is replaced by that of the moon and countless bright stars, one can understand why.

A dry area for most of the year, Manyeleti offers spectacular scenes of wildlife as they gather at water holes. Aside from the spectacular game viewing opportunities, the reserve also offers insight into the culture and traditions of the Mnisi people.

Day Itinerary

The Fly in Safari Company VIP Meet & Greet Service will assist you at O.R. Tambo International Airport with check-in procedures for your flight to Hoedspruit and guide you through the boarding gates for your flight.

Board a scheduled flight from Johannesburg to Hoedspruit Airport where your private Fly in Safari Company guide will meet you for the start of your Great South African Adventure. The drive from the airport to your accommodation, a luxury tented safari camp in the Manyeleti Private Reserve, will take approximately 1 hour.

Upon arrival at the camp, your guide will assist with check-in procedures. You will have time to enjoy lunch. Your guide will do a short pre-departure meeting with you where the itinerary will be discussed. Have time to relax and settle in.

Meet your guide in the late afternoon for your first sunset open-vehicle game drive. The Manyeleti shares an unfenced border with the Kruger National Park and is home to the famous Big Five and the rest of Africa's known big, and small game species. Enjoy sundowner drinks and snacks at a scenic location in the reserve.

As this is a private reserve, it means game drives can continue until after dark. Return to camp after sunset. Have time to freshen up before dinner is served.

Overnight: Khoka Moya Tented Camp

Bordering the Kruger National Park, between Timbavati and Sabi Sands lies Manyeleti Game Reserve. This is home to Honeyguides two tented camps, Mantobeni & Khoka Moya.

Under the profound knowledge and experience of our rangers and trackers you are guaranteed an unforgettable wildlife experience, including the Big Five, superb cuisine and service excellence.

Khoka Moya Camp is situated on both sides of a river bed and offers an authentic African experience without sacrificing luxury, safety or comfort. Each of the 15 tents are furnished in a comfortable, contemporary style with king sized beds and en-suite bathrooms.

Children of all ages are welcome and babysitting can be arranged with advance notice.



Luxury Tents

There are 15 large tents furnished in a comfortable, contemporary style. Each tent has king sized beds (can be converted to twins if required) and a large size day bed. The tents are en-suite with double showers, his & her basins and a separate toilet. The tents measure 60 square metres and can comfortably accommodate families of four, all protected with mosquito nets.

Day 2

Khoka Moya Tented Camp, Manyeleti Private Game Reserve

Day Itinerary

Wakeup call is at 6am. The morning game drive departs at 06h30 am. Typically, the drive starts by looking for tracks and signs of wildlife activity from the evening before. This will give your guides indication on which direction to follow. The area is a wildlife-rich Big Five area and home to all of Africa's famous big game species, a huge variety of antelope species, and roughly 500 bird species.

The Greater Kruger National Park is one of the most diverse wildlife areas in Africa due to the incredible variety of habitats and its sheer size. None of the wildlife in the private concession are fenced in as it shares an unfenced border with the main Kruger National Park that encompass more than 2 million hectares.

After the morning drive, you will return to camp for some rest. In between game drives, you have time to relax at the camp, making use of the excellent facilities: swimming pool, spa, lounges, decks, etc. With the camp being unfenced, don't be surprised if you spot a hyena or elephant passing through camp, or hear the roar of a lion nearby. The afternoon game drive departs at 15h30. As with the morning drive, on afternoon drives you will also track wildlife with your guides. It is common for wildlife to gather around the waterholes in the late afternoon. Return to camp around sunset for time to freshen up before dinner.

There is also an optional bush walk on offer that can be booked from the camp. discuss this with your guide if interested.

Day 3**The Highlander Country Retreat & Spa, Dullstroom**



Situated in South Africa's beautiful Mpumalanga Province, the quaint village of Dullstroom is known for its excellent fishing opportunities and fresh country air. Aptly named, Dullstroom ('stroom' meaning stream) enjoys an abundance of water, marking the beginning of the Crocodile River and home to other major tributaries. It serves as a convenient stopover for visitors on the way to the Lowveld and Kruger Park. Dullstroom piques the interest of many newcomers with its sub-alpine climate, three endangered crane species, abundant wildflowers, rare mammals, great fishing and features the highest railway station in South Africa at over 2000 metres above sea level.

Day Itinerary

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The area is a wildlife-rich Big Five area and home to all of Africa's famous big game species, a huge variety of antelope species, and roughly 500 bird species. The Greater Kruger National Park is one of the most diverse wildlife areas in Africa due to the incredible variety of habitats and its sheer size. None of the wildlife in the private concession are fenced in as it shares an unfenced border with the main Kruger National Park that encompass more than 2 million hectares.

After the morning drive, you will return to camp. We depart and head to the base of the Blyde River Canyon. Enjoy a 90-minute educational boat cruise on the Blyde River Dam and learn about the formation of the Blyde River Canyon, the third-largest canyon in the world, and about the local fauna and flora. The Blyde River Canyon is also the source of the Drakensberg Mountains.

After the boat cruise we make our way to the small village of Dullstroom located in the Mpumalanga Highlands where we spend the night.

Part of the Blyde River Canyon Nature Reserve, it showcases towering red cliffs, lush subtropical vegetation, and pristine waters. Highlights include the dramatic Three Rondavels rock formations and the sculpted Bourke's Luck Potholes, carved by swirling currents.

Adventure seekers and nature lovers can explore scenic hiking trails, take boat trips on the Blyde Dam, and enjoy breathtaking viewpoints such as God's Window. The reserve teems with wildlife, including klipspringer, grey rhebuck, oribi, and kudu, alongside a variety of bird species. With its blend of geological grandeur, biodiversity, and outdoor activities, the Blyde River Canyon offers an unforgettable South African wilderness experience.

The Blyde Canyon Adventure Centre Boat Trips offer a 90-minute guided tour through the stunning Blyde River Canyon, the world's third-largest canyon. Guests will experience the breathtaking Kadishi Tufa waterfall, known as the "weeping face of nature," and the iconic Three Rondavels. The tour provides opportunities to spot diverse wildlife, including hippos, crocodiles, and Fish Eagles. The boat trip is available daily, with multiple departure times, ensuring a flexible and memorable adventure. The tour is suitable for all ages, making it a perfect family outing or a serene escape into nature's beauty.

Day 4

the world's second tallest falls, plunging almost a kilometre from its clifftops. Nature lovers will delight in this unspoilt landscape and enjoy a wide variety of outdoor adventures.

Day Itinerary

Depart Dullstroom after breakfast. Today we make our way southeast towards the Drakensberg Mountains. Our destination is a luxury mountain lodge near the Royal Natal National Park. The region is part of the uKhahlamba Drakensberg World Heritage Site. This is South Africa's biggest mountain range and known for its towering peaks, some rising more than 3000 metres. We reach our accommodation in the late afternoon. Have time to settle in. Optional hikes from the lodge available.

Royal Natal National Park

The Royal Natal National Park is home to one of KwaZulu-Natal's most spectacular attractions - the Amphitheatre- a dramatic cliff face that measures more than five kilometres. The Tugela Falls plunge over the edge of the escarpment, plummeting down approximately 1000 metres to the Royal Natal National Park below.

A fantastic network of hiking trails meander through every part of the park, and range in difficulty from the leisurely Fairy Glen walk to the challenging hike up the Crack and down the Mudslide.

Horse riding is another popular activity, as well as trout fishing in the dam, as well as in the Mahai and Thukela rivers. There are many picturesque spots perfect for picnicking and swimming. Don't miss the opportunity to go on a guided climb against the dramatic rock faces and soak up the incredible views of the Royal Natal National Park.



Tugela Gorge

Set within South Africa's Royal Natal National Park, Tugela Gorge is a dramatic natural formation carved by the Tugela River. Known for its rugged beauty and awe-inspiring cliffs, the gorge provides a scenic backdrop to the Tugela Falls, the world's second-highest waterfall. Visitors can hike through varied terrain, crossing rivers and exploring verdant valleys before reaching the iconic "amphitheatre" rock formation, where steep rock faces rise abruptly against the sky.

Day 6

Wild Coast Sun Country Club, The Wild Coast



Stretching for over 200 kilometres along one of South Africa's most pristine, wild and beautiful sections of shoreline, the Wild Coast is renowned for its hidden coves, secluded

beaches, and rolling emerald hills. Those who love peace, quiet and the great outdoors would be hard-pressed to find a better holiday destination than this scenic wilderness, while it also provides plenty of activities to keep the active and adventurous amused, including fishing, diving, and swimming. Visitors can also look forward to exploring the traditional Xhosa villages that dot the hills, lazing in a hammock, and hiking along the breathtakingly beautiful coastline, which boasts secret swimming holes, rocky headlands, sheer cliffs, footprint-free beaches, and lazy lagoons.

Day Itinerary

Depart after breakfast. We drive towards the coast and follow the scenic coastal road towards the border of the KwaZulu-Natal and Eastern Cape Provinces. We stop at one of the seaside villages for lunch. If time allows, then we can visit the Red Desert Nature Reserve, which is located on a short detour on our route. This is known as the smallest desert on earth, and ironically, it is surrounded by a tropical region. We cross the Mtamvuna River and enter the rugged Wild Coast, previously known as the Transkei Homelands, the birthplace of Nelson Mandela.

A few kilometers into the Transkei, now known as the Eastern Cape Province, we reach our overnight destination. The hotel and resort are located on the beach and have a variety of facilities such as a golf course, water world, horseback riding, Segway tours, and the Aloha Village bowling alley, to name some highlights. You can also relax on the beach that stretches for miles on end.

It is common to spot dolphins and whales frolicking in the waves in the late afternoon. For those who have an interest in ancient fossils, you can also take a hike along the beach with your guide. Two kilometres from the hotel, along the beach, are the Mzamba fossils and Petrified Forest. When you think of a Petrified Forest, you may expect to see a forest in the traditional sense. This forest does not stand tall next to you but rather underneath; as you walk, you will see 80-million-year-old fossilized trees and deposits on the rocks.

The rest of the afternoon and evening is free to enjoy the facilities at the hotel/resort.

Overnight: Wild Coast Sun Country Club

The Wild Coast Sun Country Club is famed for being one of the top golf courses in South Africa and extends over rugged terrain along the Indian Ocean. Creating a dramatic golfing experience, this breathtaking golf course in Port Edward is played over hills, ravines, rivers, dams and waterfalls making it a challenge for professionals and amateurs alike. Right from the opening hole, which sweeps down towards a lagoon, to the 18th with the Indian Ocean as its backdrop, the par-70 golf course makes golfing an unforgettable experience.

Day 7**Garden Court Mthatha, Mthatha**

The most important urban centre in the Transkei, Umtata is a bustling city set on the Mtata River, named for the sneeze wood (umtati) trees that grow along its banks. Once the capital of the Transkei homeland, Umtata now forms part of the Eastern Cape, but is still the economic and commercial hub of the region. Attractions include the Umtata Dam, with its picnic sites and water sports opportunities, and the Nelson Mandela Museum, which documents the life and times of this phenomenal man – South Africa's most famous hero and freedom fighter – who grew up in a nearby village.

Day Itinerary

Today we have an exciting, and scenically beautiful driving day ahead of us through the diverse cultural heartland of the Transkei. In 1963, the Transkei was the first Bantustan to be granted self-governance, although in practice its autonomy was limited.

In 1976, the Transkei gained independence from South Africa (although South Africa was the only country on the international stage to recognize Transkei as its own country). As you drive through Transkei, it is most common to see rolling grasslands with villages and scattered huts dotting the hills.

This is rural South Africa. Expect traffic of a different kind, known as the Transkei Big Five: cows, dogs, pigs, donkeys, and chickens. We reach our destination, the city of Mthata and the capital of Transkei, in the afternoon. The rest of the afternoon is free to relax.

Overnight: Garden Court Mthatha

Situated in a region famed for being the birthplace of Nelson Mandela, the Garden Court Mthatha Hotel is the ideal hospitality destination for travellers to South Africa's Eastern Cape Province.

The hotel's 117 en-suite rooms are bright and modern and are equipped with air conditioning, DSTv, free uncapped Wi-Fi, comfy beds, and a great selection of other amenities. Relax in the hotel's outdoor pool or explore the area's stunning attractions. From Coffee Bay to the Nelson Mandela Museum, the hotel is perfectly located to explore the best of the Eastern Cape's Wild Coast.

Secure on-site parking, self-service workstations with copy/fax facilities, and two adaptable conference venues for events of up to 120 ensure that business guests have everything they need to stay productive while on the road.

Day 8

Morgan Bay Hotel, Eastern Cape Beaches



The Eastern Cape is endowed with some of the best beaches in South Africa – long stretches of fine white sand backed by hills blanketed with lush subtropical vegetation and, for the most part, blissfully uncrowded. The Indian Ocean waters that fringe this coast are mild throughout the year and support a myriad of marine life, including a wide array of fish species that make the region an angler's mecca. South Africa's most legendary surfing destination is located along the Eastern Cape coast: Jeffrey's Bay, renowned for its long rides and world-class barrels.

Day Itinerary

We depart after breakfast. On our route this morning, we take a detour through the small village of Qunu, the birthplace of Nelson Mandela, the place where he grew up and spent his childhood. We visit the Qunu Museum, a showcase of Nelson Mandela's life, and information about Apartheid.

After a brief visit to the small museum, we carry on. Our destination is the small village of Morgan Bay, located on the tail end of the historical Transkei Region of the Wild Coast. Upon arrival at the hotel, have time to settle in and enjoy lunch (own account).

The rest of the afternoon is free to enjoy the optional activities on offer; beaches, birding, coastal and cliff hikes, horse riding, mountain biking, or a boat cruise, to name a few.

13.1 What information do we collect?

We request and collect the following personal information on your booking form after you confirm your tour;

- passport details
- email address, home address and phone number
- contact details of next of kin
- dietary requirements
- medical conditions or allergies
- travel & medical insurance details

13.2 Why do we collect your personal information?

In order to provide our services to you, communicate with you, and to book, finalize and facilitate your tour, we have to collect your personal information.

13.3 How do we use your personal information and who might we share it with?
