Day 1

Camp Moremi, Moremi Game Reserve



Situated in the east of the Okavango Delta, Moremi Game Reserve ranks as one of the most beautiful reserves in Africa. It covers more than 4871 square kilometers of pristine wilderness, and the varied terrain includes savannah, winding waterways, and dense forest. This diverse ecosystem supports an incredibly wide spectrum of wildlife, ranging from large herds of buffalo, wildebeest and zebra, to the rare sitatunga and lechwe antelope, lion, cheetah and packs of wild dog in the open grasslands. The birdlife is prolific and includes most of the 550 bird species recorded on Botswana's national bird list.

Day Itinerary

Upon arrival at the Maun International Airport you will be welcomed by your Fly in Safari Company guide. Your guide will assist with the procedures to board your scheduled light aircraft flight into the Moremi Game Reserve, Okavango Delta.

Upon arrival at the airstrip in the Moremi Game Reserve, the open game viewer will be waiting next to the airstrip. You will enjoy your first Moremi game drive from the airstrip to the safari camp. Upon arrival at camp have time to settle in and freshen up.

In the late afternoon you will enjoy high tea before departing on the sunset game drive. The Moremi is Botswana's premier game reserve and home to an astonishing variety of Africa's big game such as lion, leopard, elephant, buffalo, giraffe, wild dog, hyena, zebra, wildebeest, a wide variety of antelope and abundant bird species.

Enjoy sundowner snacks and drinks at a scenic location in the reserve before heading back to camp after sunset. Have time to freshen up before enjoying pre-dinner drinks followed by dinner.

Recently completely rebuilt, Camp Moremi is located within Botswana's Moremi Game Reserve, situated on the edge of the Xakanaxa Lagoon in an area known for its spectacular game-viewing opportunities. Day 4

Savute Safari Lodge, Savuti - Chobe National Park



Savuti, also known as Savute lies in the heart of Botswana's beautiful Chobe National Park. This dynamic wilderness is a sweeping expanse of savannah brooded over by several rocky outcrops which guard a relic marsh and the dry channel that was once its lifeline. The Savute goes through wet and dry cycles, where wild dogs hunt in the dry river channel where crocodiles swam only twenty years ago. Visitors to this spectacular area can spot abundant wildlife including: a variety of birds, elephants, antelope, lion prides, black-backed jackal, bat-eared foxes, tsessebe, kudu, hyena, cheetah, Cape buffalo herds, and thousands of migrating zebra and wildebeest.

Day Itinerary

Game drive transfer from the lodge to the airstrip. Board a scheduled light aircraft charter flight from Moremi to the Savute airstrip. Upon arrival in the Savute, our transfer vehicle will be waiting. The transfer from the airstrip to the lodge will be your first Savute game drive.

Have time to settle in and enjoy lunch, followed by some time to relax. In the late afternoon you will enjoy a guided open vehicle game drive in the Savute. Savute is rated one of the predator capitals of Africa due to its famous interactions between lions and big game like elephants.

Due to the few accommodation options available in Savute, there are not many other visitors around, offering an exclusive game viewing experience with few crowds. As the sun starts to set we stop at a scenic location for sundowner snacks & drinks.

Return to camp after sunset for dinner and relaxation.

Located on the banks of the Savute channel, Savute Safari Lodge is intimate, accommodating only 24 guests in cool thatched timber and glass suites. The area is renowned for its population of bull elephant and for the unique interaction of the resident predator species. The close proximity of wildlife translates itself into the recently refurbished, modern African décor.

Day 7

Chobe Game Lodge, Chobe River Front



The Chobe River forms the northern boundary of the Chobe National Park, renowned for its diverse and abundant game viewing opportunities. This section of the park is best known for its dense concentration of wildlife including elephant and hippo populations, but the waters attract all manner of game including large herds of buffalo and the lions that prey on them. A visit to this area guarantees close encounters with an array of African wildlife.

Day Itinerary

Breakfast and a game drive transfer to the Savute Airstrip. Board a scheduled light aircraft flight from Savute to the Kasane Airport located in the far northern reaches of Botswana where the country meets with Zambia, Zimbabwe and Namibia.

Upon arrival at the Kasane Airport you will be transferred by road to your accommodation located inside the Chobe National Park, on the banks of the Chobe River. Have time to settle in and enjoy lunch. Later in the afternoon meet up with your guide for high tea followed by a game viewing cruise on the Chobe River. This is likely the best game viewing river cruise in Africa and you can expect excellent photo opportunities. Enjoy sundowner snacks & drinks on

the boat before heading back to the lodge at sunset. Have time to freshen up before pre-dinner drinks are served, followed by a gourmet dinner.

Day 8**Chobe Game Lodge, Chobe River Front****Day Itinerary**

An early morning wakeup call followed by a light breakfast and a game drive in the Chobe National Park. The Chobe is the oldest national park in Botswana and known as Africa's elephant kingdom. Apart from being home to most of Africa's famous big game species and abundant birdlife, the Chobe is also home to the elusive wild dogs, also known as the African Painted Wolf when we translate their scientific name *Lycaon Pictus*, to English.

Halfway into the drive we stop to stretch legs and enjoy some refreshments. Return to the lodge for some rest. Lunch is served at the lodge. In the later afternoon we meet up again for high tea followed by the afternoon / sunset game drive inside the Chobe Park.

Around sunset we stop for sundowner drinks and snacks. Return to the lodge after sunset for dinner and relaxation.

Day 9**Waterberry Zambezi Lodge, Victoria Falls (Zambia)**



One of the original natural wonders of the world, the Victoria Falls is a World Heritage Site and an extremely popular tourist attraction. Known locally as 'The Smoke that Thunders' this spectacle is accessible from both Zambia and Zimbabwe and it is an ideal place to combine game viewing and water sports. There is excellent fishing, a terrifying bungee jump and arguably the best commercial white-water rafting in the world.

Day Itinerary

Enjoy one final morning safari activity before getting transferred across the Botswana border into Zambia. Your guide will assist with immigration formalities to cross into Zambia. We cross from Botswana into Zambia via the Kazungula Bridge.

The drive from the border to your accommodation located on the banks of the Zambezi River is just under an hour. Upon arrival at your accommodation have time to settle in and enjoy lunch. Meet up with your guide in the late afternoon for a sunset cruise on the Zambezi River. This relaxing cruise is an excellent introduction to the area and known to offer sightings of hippo, elephant, crocodile and a variety of bird species.

End the activity while sipping on a refreshing drink and watching a beautiful sunset over the mighty Zambezi. Return to the lodge after sunset and have time to freshen up before dinner is served.

Waterberry's scenic position on the banks of the Zambezi, with excellent accommodation and outstanding service, makes it the perfect base for a visit to Victoria Falls while escaping the busy town.

Guests can choose between three different accommodation options – bright, individual rooms in the 7-room lodge, a private safari house or a luxury tented woodland site.

Waterberry Lodge on the Zambezi riverbank has spacious sun and dining terraces, a lounge to enjoy the panoramic views, and magnificent gardens with individual cottages dotted around the lawns and along the river. An inviting swimming pool is surrounded by rockery gardens.

The River Farmhouse is a private riverside safari house sleeping up to 10, with magnificent views across the infinity pool to the Zambezi and the national park opposite.

The Woodlands Forest Tents set in the shady woods of the conservation area are perfect for birdwatching and relaxing in the peaceful wild.

An international Zambian, German and British team run this independently owned lodge and Waterberry is a proud community partner. Guests are able to witness rural Zambian life first hand, and see how tourism is genuinely giving back with schools, a farming cooperative and adult skills centre.



Waterberry Zambezi Lodge

With seven thatched cottages set in beautiful gardens or along the riverbank, Waterberry is famous for good service, great food and the very best of Zambian hospitality.

Each thatched cottage is different. All are en suite with a private terrace and inside lounge seating. Furnished in clean colourful style, with huge comfortable beds made by our local craftsmen, each room has air conditioning, ceiling fan and electric blankets for cold nights and a safe for personal belongings. The en suite shower rooms are stocked with toiletries, bathrobes and a hair dryer. The rooms have a mix of double, twin and triple beds with one family unit (Owl House) having two en suite bedrooms and a lounge.

Waterberry Zambezi Lodge, Victoria Falls (Zambia)

Day Itinerary

Start the day with a gourmet breakfast followed by a visit to the Victoria Falls for as guided tour of one of the most spectacular natural wonders in the world. Locally, the Victoria Falls are called Mosi-oa-Tunya, meaning 'The Smoke that Thunders'. At 1600 meters wide and over 100 meters tall, the Victoria Falls is the biggest curtain of falls in the world.

Return to the lodge after a tour of the falls. For an afternoon activity you can choose between another Zambezi River cruise, fishing, an island picnic, guided birding, a guided village walk or a guided tour of town & local markets.

End the day with sundowner snacks & drinks while reminiscing about the exciting day you had with your fellow travellers.

Day 11

Kafunta River Lodge, South Luangwa National Park



Bordering the Luangwa River, the northern and southern Luangwa National Parks contain some of the most breath-taking and untouched wilderness in Africa. Because of this and the parks' successful anti-poaching campaigns, the area has developed into a world-renowned wildlife haven. The South Luangwa National Park is renowned for its walking safari, which allows visitors to view elephant, hippo and even lion close-up under the supervision of professional and knowledgeable armed guides.

Day Itinerary

Meet your guide after breakfast for a transfer to the Livingstone Airport. Board a private light aircraft charter flight from Livingstone to the South Luangwa National Park (Mfuwe Airport) where you will spend the next three nights.

Upon arrival at the Mfuwe Airport we will be transferred by road to our accommodation on the banks of the Luangwa River. The lodge offers easy access to the wildlife rich wilderness areas of the South Luangwa National Park. upon arrival at the lodge have time to settle in and enjoy lunch. Later in the afternoon we depart on a sunset game drive in the park.

The South Luangwa is Zambia's premier national Park and also known as the valley of the leopards. What makes this park really appealing is the great concentrations of wildlife combined with lesser crowds compared to other well-known parks in Africa. Game drives can be described as raw and authentic.

Return to the lodge after sunset and have time to freshen up before enjoying pre-dinner drinks followed by a gourmet dinner.

Overnight: Kafunta River Lodge [View iBrochure](#)

Kafunta River Lodge is owned and operated by Anke & Ron Cowan who have made the Luangwa Valley their home for over 27 years.

The 10-room lodge is located on the floodplains of the Luangwa River, south of the park's main gate. During the peak season, the lodge accesses the national park via its own pontoon, as a convenient alternative.

Central to the lodge is a spacious bar and dining area. Built around a semi-evergreen wild mango tree and thatched in the traditional style, it offers superb panoramic views over the Luangwa floodplain and the South Luangwa National Park. Great game viewing and bird watching start right at the lodge!

Adjacent to the bar is a refreshing infinity pool and the only natural hot spring tub in the Luangwa Valley. This unique hot tub is fed from a source on Kafunta's grounds, offering a

constant temperature of 38 degrees. Activities on offer include game drives, bush walks, village & cultural tours, as well as a wellness spa.

Since the end of 2023, the lodge includes a private tented villa, The Sunset House, with 3 en-suite bedrooms. Perfect for multi-generation families or small groups of friends seeking privacy and flexibility.



Kafunta Standard Chalet

The lodge features 8 standard chalets, constructed from thatch and wood to blend seamlessly with the natural surroundings. Each chalet includes a twin-bedded bedroom, en-suite bathroom, minibar fridge, and ceiling fan. A private verandah overlooks the floodplains, offering sweeping views of the landscape and frequent sightings of passing wildlife.

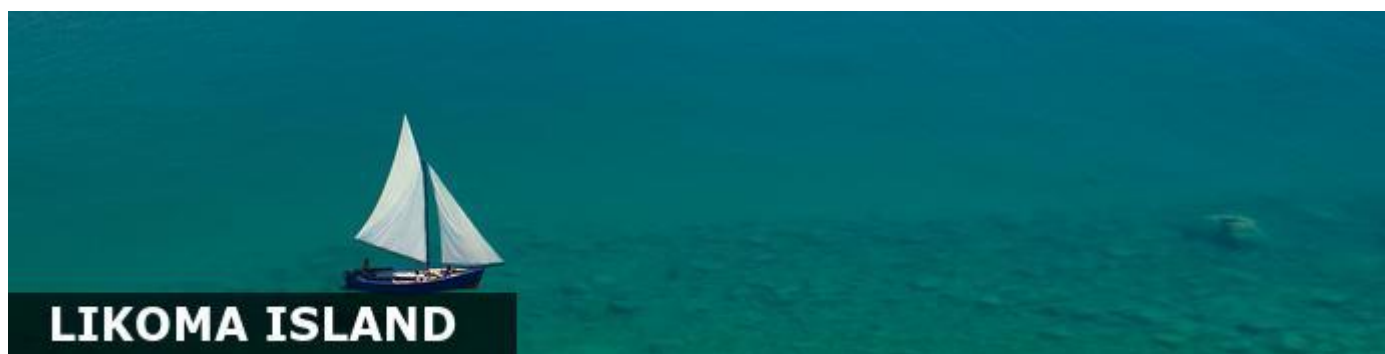

Day 14**Kaya Mawa, Likoma Island**



Although in Mozambican waters, Likoma Island is Malawian territory. It is the larger of the two inhabited islands in Lake Malawi, measuring seventeen square kilometres. It boasts some lovely beaches, friendly locals, and predominantly flat terrain with a baobab dotted south. It is home to the headquarters of the University Mission to Central Africa, Livingstone's mission, and hence it remained British territory when the Lake was divided politically after World War Two. The island is famous for its large cathedral, St. Peter's Cathedral, featuring numerous stained glass and carved intricate soapstone details. Visitors can look forward to relaxing on pristine beaches, snorkelling and diving in the crystal-clear waters, as well as enjoying a variety of watersport.

Day Itinerary

Transfer to the Mfuwe Airport. At the Mfuwe Airport your guide will assist with all the formalities before boarding your light aircraft charter flight to Malawi. As we enter a new country, we have to do a stopover in Lilongwe (Malawi) to for customs and immigration formalities before continuing on a charter flight to the remote Likoma Island.
