

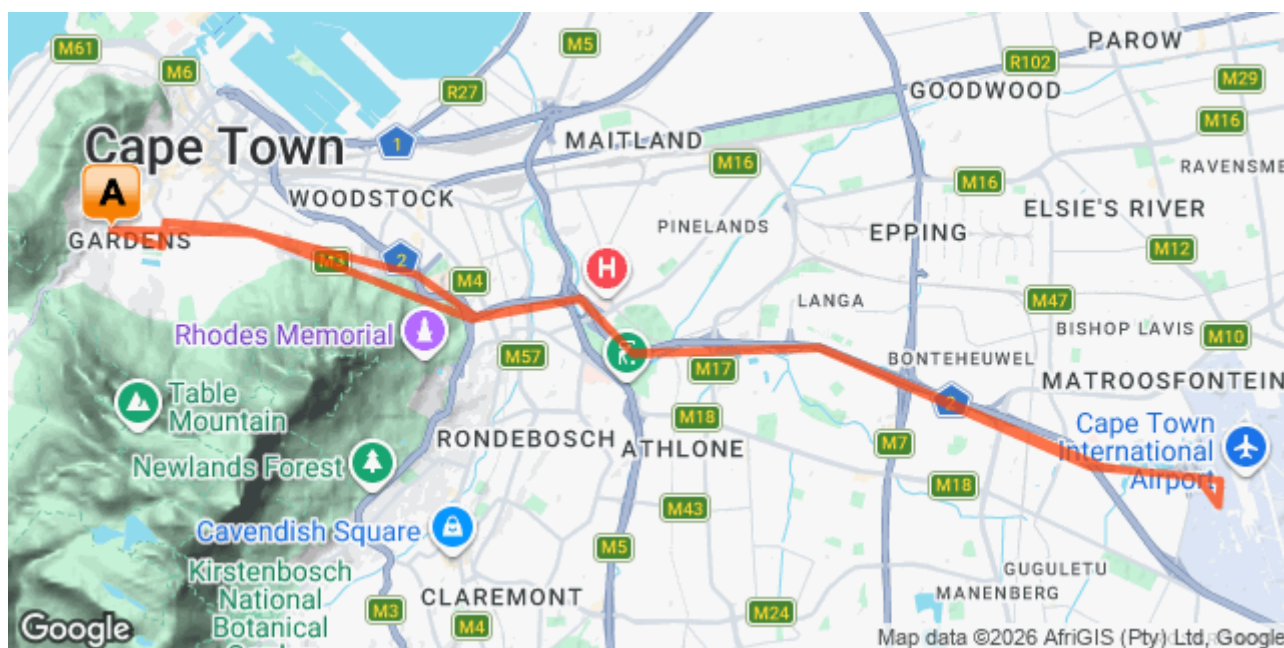

Day Itinerary

Meet your guide after breakfast. This morning you will visit Table Mountain. You will get to the top by means of the rotating cable car. At an elevation of 1086 metres Table Mountain overlooks the city of Cape Town and is known as one of the 'New 7 Wonders of Nature' and a World Heritage Site. The traditional Khoi San name for Table Mountain is 'Hoerikwaggo', meaning mountain in the sea, while the modern name of Table Mountain refers to its flat top.

On the top of Table Mountain there is a variety of tracks and viewpoints you can explore offering breathtaking views of Cape Town, Table Bay, Robben Island and the Peninsula. Your guide will take you on an informative walk to the different viewpoints.

After Table Mountain you will visit the Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens. Your guide will take you on a guided walk through the gardens, one of Cape Town's most visited attractions, and rated one of the most beautiful and unique Botanical Gardens in the world as the Cape Floral kingdom is the smallest, but most diverse vegetation biome in the world.

After Kirstenbosch you will head to the V&A Waterfront where you can enjoy lunch at one of the many restaurants (own account). After lunch have time to explore the Waterfront complex, a shopping and entertainment hotspot. The Watershed hall at the Waterfront is an excellent option for shopping for artisanal locally produced arts, crafts, clothes, gifts and souvenirs.

Return to your hotel in the late afternoon.

Table Mountain

Table Mountain is the most iconic landmark of South Africa. Aside from being the country's most photographed attraction and the perfect place to take photos of the landscape of Cape Town, it is also home to about 2,200 species of plants and 1,470 floral species, many of

which are endemic to the mountain. Animal species that can be spotted on the mountain include caracals, rock hyraxes and chacma baboons. The flat top peak of the mountain reaches 1,086 metres above sea level, but being so close to the sea and to the city, its features look more imposing.



Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens

Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens is a botanical paradise nestled at the eastern foot of Table Mountain in Cape Town, South Africa. Spanning over 36 hectares, it showcases a stunning array of indigenous plants, including a vast collection of fynbos, cycads, and proteas. Visitors can explore its well-maintained pathways, which lead to various themed gardens, including a fragrance garden and a medicinal garden. Kirstenbosch is not only a botanical wonderland but also a hub for cultural events and live music concerts, offering a unique blend of nature and entertainment in a truly breathtaking setting.



V&A Waterfront

The V&A Waterfront in Cape Town is a vibrant hub of culture, history, and entertainment. Originally a harbour, it has transformed into a world-class destination. With roots dating back to 1860, it seamlessly blends historical landmarks with modern attractions. Visitors can explore its diverse offerings, including luxury accommodations, delectable dining, captivating museums, and thrilling boat rides. At the Cape Point Nature Reserve you will visit the historical lighthouse, enjoy scenic walking trails with viewpoints, visit the Cape of Good Hope and also enjoy a guided drive through the reserve. From Cape Point we have a short drive to Simon's Town, South Africa's historical naval town.

In Simon's Town we visit the Boulder's Beach endangered penguin colony where you can get close-up photos of the penguins and learn interesting facts about these endangered marine birds from your naturalist guide. Return to Cape Town in the late afternoon.

Chapman's Peak

Chapman's Peak Drive winds its way between Noordhoek and Hout Bay. Situated on the Atlantic Coast, at the south-western tip of South Africa, it is one of the most spectacular scenic drives in the world. The 9km route, with its 114 curves, skirts the rocky coastline of Chapman's Peak. The drive offers stunning 180-degree views with many areas along the route where visitors can stop and take in the scenery or sit down for a relaxing picnic.



Cape Point Nature Reserve

Cape Point Nature Reserve, located at the southern tip of the Cape Peninsula within Table Mountain National Park, is a dramatic convergence of land and sea where towering cliffs rise above the Atlantic Ocean. Renowned for its rich biodiversity and endemic fynbos vegetation, Cape Point offers travellers panoramic views, invigorating hikes, and a ride on the Flying Dutchman funicular to the historic lighthouse. Visitors can explore scenic lookouts, dine at the acclaimed Two Oceans Restaurant, and enjoy a picnic in the fresh coastal air, all while immersed in one of South Africa's most iconic natural landscapes.



Boulders Penguin Colony

Boulders Penguin Colony is located near Cape Town, South Africa. This popular tourist attraction offers visitors the chance to observe African penguins at close range and learn more about them. The section also includes three boardwalks that provide easy access to the beach area, and sheltered areas for viewing the birds.



Kalk Bay

Set on the scenic coast of False Bay, Kalk Bay is a charming seaside village adorned with a fisherman's harbour and a vibrant Main Road lined with quaint shops that offer unique treasures and local crafts.

The village boasts a diverse culinary scene, with its restaurants serving delectable seafood dishes and other culinary delights. Overlooking the bay, visitors can enjoy breathtaking sea views and explore the mysterious Boomslang Caves, adding an adventurous touch to this picturesque coastal gem.

1. Pricing

Until final payment is received, all pricing is subject to change without notice due to supplier increases or currency fluctuations. The Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd will not be held liable for any price increases due to currency fluctuations. The prices listed are based on the costs and exchange rates current at the time of pricing. All rates are subject to change due to circumstances outside the control of the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd.

2. Deposit Payment

A non-refundable deposit of 50% of the full amount is required at the time of booking, with the balance to be paid not later than 60 days prior to departure of the tour. The following exceptions will apply: 1. Should any of the supplier's conditions vary from the above terms and conditions. 2. Should bookings be made less than 60 days prior to arrival full payment is required immediately.

3. Cancellation by traveller

The date of cancellation shall be the date on which the written notification is received by the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd After full payment, cancellation fees on trips will be a minimum of 50% per person of the value of the trip, plus any supplier fees on the land portion of your booking. Some airline tickets are non-refundable and in cases like this cancellation fees can be up to 100% of the value of the booking.

Please note: no-shows will be treated as cancellations and the necessary cancellation fees applied.

4. Cancellation Fees:

If you cancel a tour with Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd after making a booking you will lose some or all the money you have paid for the trip. A cancellation will only be effective when we receive written confirmation of the cancellation. If you cancel a tour:

- 60 days or more prior to departure, we will retain your deposit.
- Between 30 – 59 days prior to departure, we will retain the deposit or 100% of the tour cost, whichever is greatest.
- Less than 30 days prior to departure we will retain 100% paid by you in connection with the booking.
- Any of the supplier's specific conditions that vary from the above will apply.

5. Refunds

No refunds will be made after departure. Prior to final payment, the deposit will be non-refundable.

6. Amendments to bookings

The Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd will not be liable for any loss or damage that may be incurred by the alteration, suspension or curtailment of services. If you wish to change your booking in any way, the following fees will apply:

- a. Changes to any other arrangements made in conjunction with your tour booking like hotels, transfers, flights and activities.
- b. No amendments are permitted to your booking within 10 days of departure.

7. Passport, visa and other travel documents

It is the client's responsibility to ensure that all documents, passport and visas are valid. The Fly in Safari Co. 8. Health

It is the responsibility of the client to consult a health professional with respect to recommended and compulsory vaccinations and health pre-cautions. Anti-malaria precautions are recommended for all tours and clients are advised to bring insect repellent.

9. Baggage information

All tours utilizing light aircraft transfers allow a maximum limit of 20 kg baggage per person, soft bags only. The Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd may not be held responsible for any loss or damage to luggage during the tour program. The acceptance of final documents, vouchers or tickets shall be deemed to be consent to the above conditions.

10. Airline responsibility clause

The carriers concerned are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time the passengers are not aboard the aircraft or conveyance. The passenger ticket shall constitute the sole contract between the airline and the passenger. All personal effects and baggage are always the client's responsibility and the Fly in Safari Co. We request and collect the following personal information on your booking form after you confirm your tour;

13.2 Why do we collect your personal information?

In order to provide our services to you, communicate with you, and to book, finalize and facilitate your tour, we have to collect your personal information.

13.3 How do we use your personal information and who might we share it with?

In order to book, finalize and facilitate your tour, we may, or may not share your details with the service providers involved to make your tour happen. These service providers may, or may not include; airlines, charter companies, accommodation establishments (lodges, hotels and/or guesthouses), ground transportation operators, activity operators, emergency evacuation insurance providers, VIP meet & greet services etc.

13.4 How do we protect your personal information?

We strive to encrypt all sensitive data, both in transit and at rest, to protect it from unauthorized access.

Strong Passwords and Authentication

Software Updates

We regularly update our system software and related applications to patch security vulnerabilities.

13.5 Who has access to your personal information?

Only The Fly in safari Company and relevant service providers necessary in order to book and facilitate your tour, will have access to your personal information.

13.6 How long do we retain your personal information?

We will retain your personal information for as long as necessary to fulfil the purpose for which it was collected, but no longer than required by law or for legitimate business purposes. POPIA, the Protection of Personal Information Act, dictates that records should be retained for the period necessary or as authorized by law. Additionally, financial institutions need to retain records related to customer due diligence for at least 5 years from the termination of the business relationship or conclusion of a single transaction, according to the Financial Intelligence Centre Act (FICA).

14. Disclosure

Please be aware that during your participation in this tour certain risks and dangers may arise, including, but not limited to, the hazards of travelling in undeveloped areas, travel by boat, train, automobile, aircraft or other means travelling, the forces of nature, political unrest and accident or illness in remote regions without means of rapid evacuation or medical facilities. Be aware and clearly understand that the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd will not have liability regarding provisions of medical care or the adequacy of any care that may be rendered.
