

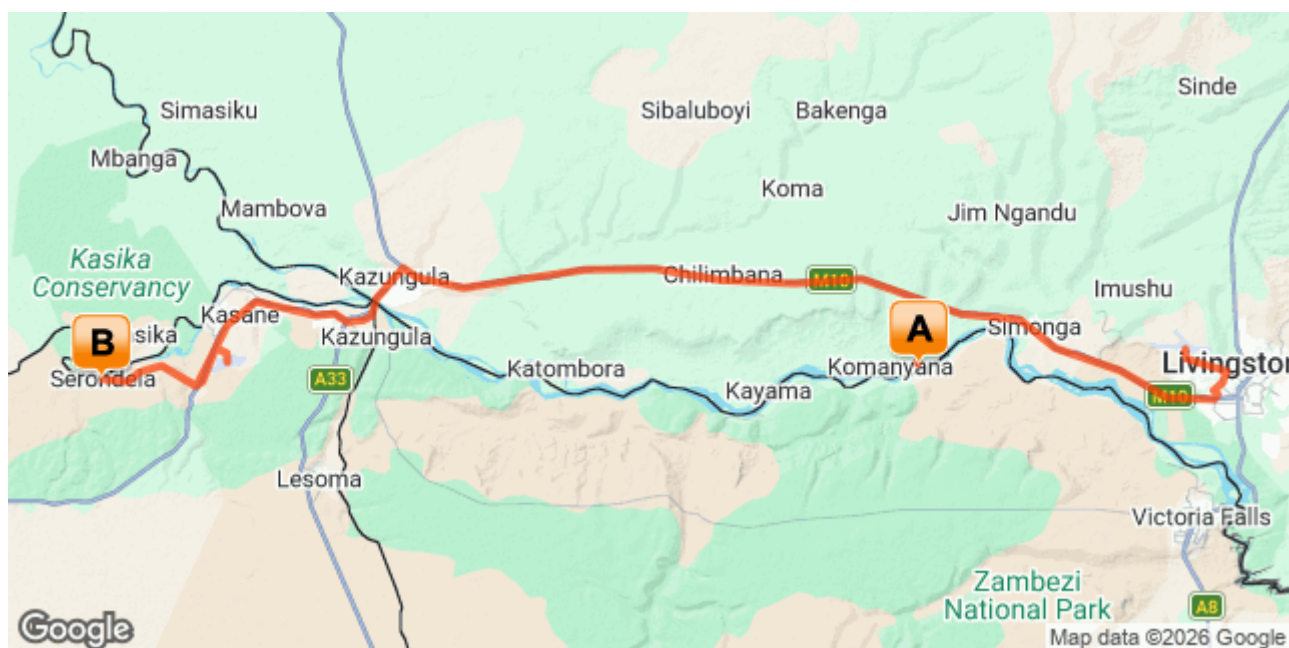

Introduction

Our 5 Day Chobe & Victoria Falls Safari is one of our independent safaris exploring the Victoria Falls (Zambia) and the Chobe National Park (Botswana). At both destinations you will stay in luxury on the banks of two of Africa's iconic rivers; the Zambezi River in Zambia, and the Chobe River in Botswana. The close proximity of these two destinations to each other, make this an unbeatable short safari offering maximum diversity with a wide range of included activities.

Our independent safaris have the same advantages as our guided safaris, but the only difference is that you don't travel with a private Fly in Safari Company guide. All tour arrangements are taken care of from the moment you arrive, until you depart again.

Although a variety of activities are included, the main highlights are; a tour of the Victoria Falls, a guided sunset river cruise on the Zambezi River (including snacks & drinks; alcoholic & non-alcoholic), guided Chobe River cruises and a 4x4 open vehicle game drive in the Chobe National Park.

The safari starts in Livingstone, Zambia, and ends in Kasane, Botswana.

Day 1

Waterberry Zambezi Lodge, Victoria Falls (Zambia)



One of the original natural wonders of the world, the Victoria Falls is a World Heritage Site and an extremely popular tourist attraction. Known locally as 'The Smoke that Thunders' this spectacle is accessible from both Zambia and Zimbabwe and it is an ideal place to combine game viewing and water sports. There is excellent fishing, a terrifying bungee jump and arguably the best commercial white-water rafting in the world.

Day Itinerary

Upon arrival at the Livingstone International Airport you will be welcomed by a Fly in Safari Company representative. Road transfer to your accommodation near the banks of the Zambezi River. Upon arrival at your accommodation have time to settle in and relax.

This afternoon you will enjoy Zambezi River cruise. Your guide will educate you on the surrounding area, the Zambezi, the wildlife and birdlife you will encounter. Enjoy a variety of snacks & drinks while watching the sun set over the mighty Zambezi River. Return to the lodge after sunset.

Your stay is fully inclusive of spacious luxury accommodation, all meals & beverages, transfers, and a variety of activities from the lodge; Victoria Falls (Zambia and Zimbabwe entrance fee own account), boat cruises on the Zambezi, fishing, island picnic, guided birding, guided village walk, guided tour of town & local markets.

Waterberry's scenic position on the banks of the Zambezi, with excellent accommodation and outstanding service, makes it the perfect base for a visit to Victoria Falls while escaping the busy town. Guests can choose between three different accommodation options – bright, individual rooms in the 7-room lodge, a private safari house or a luxury tented woodland site.

Waterberry Lodge on the Zambezi riverbank has spacious sun and dining terraces, a lounge to enjoy the panoramic views, and magnificent gardens with individual cottages dotted around the lawns and along the river. An inviting swimming pool is surrounded by rockery gardens. The River Farmhouse is a private riverside safari house sleeping up to 10, with magnificent views across the infinity pool to the Zambezi and the national park opposite. The Woodlands Forest Tents set in the shady woods of the conservation area are perfect for birdwatching and relaxing in the peaceful wild.

An international Zambian, German and British team run this independently owned lodge and Waterberry is a proud community partner. Guests are able to witness rural Zambian life first hand, and see how tourism is genuinely giving back with schools, a farming cooperative and adult skills centre.



Waterberry Lodge - Lodge Cottages

The Waterberry cottages are set around lawns, gardens and the Zambezi riverbank. Named after birds found around the lodge, these are lovely cool rooms open to the high thatch. All have private terraces and are en-suite with air conditioning, ceiling fan, mosquito nets, private terrace, inside and outside lounge seating, Wifi, toiletries, hairdryer, gowns, water, hand sanitiser. Private dining on the terrace is available on request. The versatile cottages are doubles, twins or triplets with one two-storey family house that is particularly good for families.

Day Itinerary

Today you will visit the mighty Victoria Falls, one of the original Seven Natural Wonders of Nature and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. At 1600 metres wide and over 100 metres tall, the Victoria Falls is the widest curtain of falls in the world and a spectacular site. There is also an arts & craft market located at the falls where you can do some souvenir shopping. After visiting the Falls, you will head back to the lodge, unless you have planned an activity to visit the town. You have two activities included today. Included activities range between; Victoria Falls visit (Zambia and Zimbabwe entrance fee own account), sunset, daytime or dawn cruise on the Zambezi, fishing, island picnic, guided birding, guided village walk, guided tour of town & local markets. Your guide at the lodge will discuss your activity schedule with you based on your preferences.

Day 3

Chobe Game Lodge, Chobe River Front



The Chobe River forms the northern boundary of the Chobe National Park, renowned for its diverse and abundant game viewing opportunities. This section of the park is best known for its dense concentration of wildlife including elephant and hippo populations, but the waters attract all manner of game including large herds of buffalo and the lions that prey on them. A visit to this area guarantees close encounters with an array of African wildlife.

Day Itinerary

If time allows, then you have the morning free to do one final activity. You will be transferred to the Zambia / Botswana border post (40 min). Your transfer driver will assist with border

formalities to cross into Botswana. Once you cross into Botswana, it is only a short drive to your accommodation located on the banks of the Chobe River. Upon arrival at the lodge you will have time to settle in and relax, and enjoy lunch. While in the Chobe all your safari activities are included and range between; 2x guided river safaris and 1x guided open vehicle game drive in the Chobe Park.

Later in the afternoon you will depart on a sunset game viewing river cruise on the Chobe River. With the Chobe being known as the elephant kingdom of Africa, it is common to spot these gentle giants in large numbers. Apart from elephants you can also see a wide variety of antelope species, buffalo, hippo, crocodiles and more than 500 different bird species. Enjoy snacks & drinks while watching the sun set over the Chobe. Return to the lodge after sunset and have the rest of the evening free to relax. Dinner at the lodge.

Counter-balancing the wilderness are restful, air conditioned, en-suite lodgings. Graceful high arches, quarry tiled floors and barrel-vaulted ceilings create an atmosphere of cool tranquillity. Other facilities include a large swimming pool with terrace, a riverside boma area, a stylish bar with an outside terrace, an expansive deck offering magnificent views over the Chobe River as well as conference facilities for business travellers. All meals are catered for in various locations throughout the lodge including the terrace, boma and riverfront deck.

Inside the rooms are all the amenities and comforts you expect from a luxury safari lodge. Day Itinerary

This morning you will enjoy a guided open vehicle game drive in the Chobe National Park. The Chobe is Botswana's oldest national Park and located in the northern corner of Botswana, near the meeting point of 4 countries; Botswana, Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The Chobe falls within the KAZA Conservation area, a massive wildlife zone between Botswana, Angola, Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe, that is home to large herds of migrating animals and wildlife corridors. On your game drive you will search for lion, leopard, elephant, buffalo, giraffe, zebra, kudu and the elusive painted wolves to name some. The birdlife in the Chobe is also prolific. Halfway through the drive you will stop to stretch legs and enjoy snacks and drinks.

Return to the lodge before it gets too hot. Have time to relax and enjoy lunch. In the late afternoon you will depart on another river safari and enjoy snacks and drinks while watching the sunset. Return to the lodge after sunset for dinner and relaxation.

It is believed that watermelon originated here.

1. Pricing

Until final payment is received, all pricing is subject to change without notice due to supplier increases or currency fluctuations. The Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd will not be held liable for any price increases due to currency fluctuations. The prices listed are based on the costs and exchange rates current at the time of pricing. All rates are subject to change due to circumstances outside the control of the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd.

2. Deposit Payment

A non-refundable deposit of 50% of the full amount is required at the time of booking, with the balance to be paid not later than 60 days prior to departure of the tour. The following exceptions will apply: 1. Should any of the supplier's conditions vary from the above terms and conditions. 2. Should bookings be made less than 60 days prior to arrival full payment is required immediately.

3. Cancellation by traveller

The date of cancellation shall be the date on which the written notification is received by the Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd After full payment, cancellation fees on trips will be a minimum of 50% per person of the value of the trip, plus any supplier fees on the land portion of your booking. Some airline tickets are non-refundable and in cases like this cancellation fees can be up to 100% of the value of the booking.

Please note: no-shows will be treated as cancellations and the necessary cancellation fees applied.

4. Cancellation Fees:

If you cancel a tour with Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd after making a booking you will lose some or all the money you have paid for the trip. A cancellation will only be effective when we receive written confirmation of the cancellation. If you cancel a tour:

- 60 days or more prior to departure, we will retain your deposit.
- Between 30 – 59 days prior to departure, we will retain the deposit or 100% of the tour cost, whichever is greatest.
- Less than 30 days prior to departure we will retain 100% paid by you in connection with the booking.
- Any of the supplier's specific conditions that vary from the above will apply.

5. Refunds

No refunds will be made after departure. Prior to final payment, the deposit will be non-refundable.

6. Amendments to bookings

The Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd will not be liable for any loss or damage that may be incurred by the alteration, suspension or curtailment of services. If you wish to change your booking in any way, the following fees will apply:

- a. Changes to any other arrangements made in conjunction with your tour booking like hotels, transfers, flights and activities.
- b. No amendments are permitted to your booking within 10 days of departure.

7. Passport, visa and other travel documents

It is the client's responsibility to ensure that all documents, passport and visas are valid. The Fly in Safari Co. All tours utilizing light aircraft transfers allow a maximum limit of 20 kg baggage per person, soft bags only. The Fly in Safari Co. (Pty) Ltd may not be held responsible for any loss or damage to luggage during the tour program. The acceptance of final documents, vouchers or tickets shall be deemed to be consent to the above conditions.

10. Airline responsibility clause

The carriers concerned are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time the passengers are not aboard the aircraft or conveyance. The passenger ticket shall constitute the sole contract between the airline and the passenger. All personal effects and baggage are always the client's responsibility and the Fly in Safari Co. 13.2 Why do we collect your personal information?

In order to provide our services to you, communicate with you, and to book, finalize and facilitate your tour, we have to collect your personal information.

In order to book, finalize and facilitate your tour, we may, or may not share your details with the service providers involved to make your tour happen. POPIA, the Protection of Personal Information Act, dictates that records should be retained for the period necessary or as authorized by law. Additionally, financial institutions need to retain records related to customer due diligence for at least 5 years from the termination of the business relationship or conclusion of a single transaction, according to the Financial Intelligence Centre Act (FICA).
